Hugh Scott, U.S. Senator from Pennsylvania, will be the featured speaker Feb. 14 at the Jackson County Republican Lincoln Day Dinner according to Mrs. Eve Nye, central committee chairman.

Scott was elected to the U.S. Senate in 1958 after serving for 16 years as a member of the U.S. House of Representatives. He was National Chairman of the Republican Party, 1948-1949 and chairman of several committees for Eisenhower during the 1952 campaign.

Money Given Mercy Flight By TB Group

Mercy Flights, Inc. has been given a donation of \$500 to help with the purchase of a new plane by the Jackson County Tuberculosis and Health association. It was announced today by Mrs. Vernon Thorpe, treasurer of the association.

The donation was voted by the board of directors of the TB and Health Association using funds from a bequest made to the association by Bennie E. Westgate, an area resident until his death last year.

Because Mercy Flights has in turn agreed to transport patients with tuberculosis needing emergency treatment at the Oregon State Sanatorium in Salem, the donation will benefit the Jackson County Health department as well as TB patients and their families. Dr. A. E. Merkel, county health officer stated today. Tuberculosis is a communicable disease and the health department is, therefore, charged with legal responsibility for transportation and care of TB patients to prevent further infections. No isolation facilities for extended care are available in the county for treatment of TB and patients are asked to go to the sanatorium in Salem, Dr. Merkel explained.

Accepting the check for Mercy Flights was George Milligan, founder of the non-profit organization which is credited with saving many lives. Milligan emphasized today that more patients are now being flown to Medford for treatment from other areas than those flown to outside facilities.

Work Smarter, Not Harder

YES, MRS. HOMEMAKER, THERE IS NO SANTA CLAUS. What we mean is, you can't get something for nothing. Some "fly by night" salesmen may promise you gifts or commissions for giving them names of prospects. There's usually a "string attached."

A new law passed by the 1965 Oregon legislature outlaws this type of sales practice if the seller knowingly makes false statements. Before you sign any agreement, read it carefully, including all the fine print.

Some items which have been sold by unlawful business practices include aluminum siding, termite control, freezer food plans and vocational courses. If you suspect anyone of unlawful selling, call your local Chamber of Commerce or police. Your County Extension office can give you more information on consumer problems.

EXCESSIVE WEAR OF WASHABLE CLOTHES IS A COMMON COMPLAINT FROM HOMEMAKERS. There are at least two possible explanations. Resin treated cotton and rayon wash and wear, especially the inexpensive garments, have shorter life than untreated ones. They may wear quickly along edges of collars and cuffs. Some of the better fabrics have compensated for this by increasing the number of threads to the inch.

Another cause of wear may be over bleaching. This weakens and roughens the fabric. Use a chlorine bleach moderately and in amounts given on the bottle. Oxygen type bleaches can be used safely each time the garment is laundered.

BEWARE OF CARBON TETRACHLORIDE POISONING. This chemical is an ingredient of commonly used products such as certain cleaning fluids, spot removers and repair materials for tires.

Media Specialists Told Of 8-Week Summer Institute

A summer institute to train educational media specialists will be held on the Oregon State University campus next summer for the second consecutive year.

The institute will be under the administration of the Division of Continuing Education of the Oregon State System of Higher Education.

Robert Nicholas, manager of consultation and training for the audiovisual instruction unit of the Division, in Corvallis, will serve as director.

The eight-week program, which is funded under the National Defense Education Act and offers enrollees 12 quarters hours of college credit, will be held June 20 - Aug. 12.

Program Training
Fifty teachers or school librarians will be trained, during the course of the program, to serve as educational media co-

ordinators for single elementary or secondary schools. Each enrollee will be provided with an opportunity to learn methods of selection, utilization, production, and supervision of modern communications media and materials. Each will also be given the opportunity to develop skills which will enable them to assume responsibility for educational media programs in his respective school. Institute enrollees will be selected from the six western states—Oregon, Washington, Idaho, Montana, Alaska, and Hawaii. Each will receive a stipend of \$75 a week, plus an additional \$15 a week per dependent.

Applicants will be required to have had two years of full-time experience as a teacher or librarian in an elementary or secondary school.

Other requirements include that they be under contract to teach during 1966-67 with at least a part-time responsibility assigned as an educational media specialist.

They must also have completed a basic audiovisual course, and have not already taken more than 12 quarter hours of audiovisual courses at the college level.

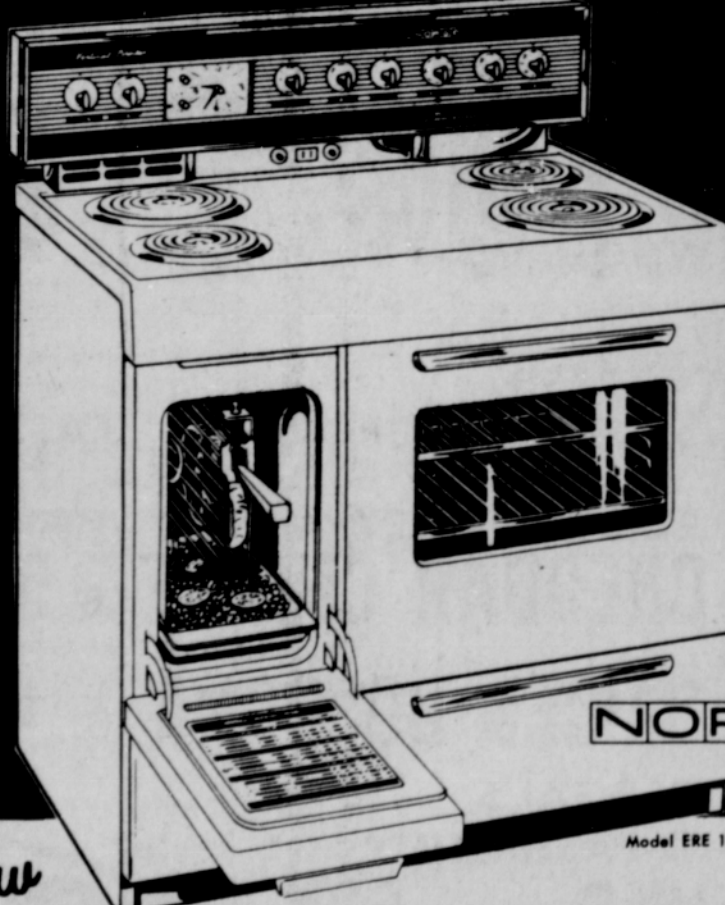
