Sealed bids for the construction of an Addition to Patrick Elementary School, Gold Hill, Oregon, for Jackson County School District 6, will be received at the office of the District Superintendent, 451 North 2nd, Central Point, Oregon, until 8:00 P.M., Pacific Daylight Time, May 17, 1966, and will then be publicly opened and read aloud. The drawings, specifications and other contract documents may be examined and copies thereof obtained at the office of Seibert, Hunter, Shute & Plunley, Architects, 77 Century Building, 343 East Main Street, Medford, Oregon, on or after April 29, 1966. A deposit of \$50.00 per set of drawings and specifications will be required. Bidders returning documents in good condition within seven days after the bid opening will be refunded their deposit.

This project involves the construction of a five classroom and library addition, with necessary toilets, work rooms and covered walks, of approximately 8,622 sq. ft., plus approximately 3,565 sq. ft. of covered walks. Construction shall be concrete slab, cement block and wood frame.

All classifications will be covered under the General Contract Proposal.

Attention is called to the bidders prequalification requirements of ORS 279.010 to 279.026, inclusive, which must be filed with the School District Clerk 10 days before the date of opening of bids and for which forms may be obtained at the office of the Architect.

All proposals must be accompanied by a certified check, cashier's check or bid bond made payable to School District 6, in an amount not less than 5% of the bid.

The successful bidder will be required to furnish a faithful performance bond in the full amount of the contract price as required for a public contract pursuant to ORS 279.510.
