The event will be held in the Houston building, the former Shady Cove Market location.

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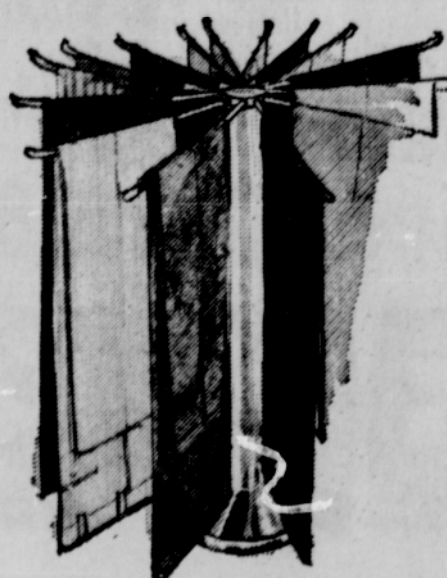
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
