## Kitchen Korner



Want to try something different? One of our favorites is Green Tomato Relish, which is delicious with any kind of meat, and especially good on Navy beans, really dresses them up. Oh yes, always good for hamburgers too.

**GREEN TOMATO RELISH**  
6 quarts ground green tomatoes  
12 medium onions, ground  
4 green peppers, ground  
4 sweet red peppers, ground  
3/4 cup salt (not iodized)  
1/4 cup mustard seed  
1/4 to 1/2 cup celery seed  
3 tablespoons tumeric  
3 1/2 cups sugar (white)  
2 cups brown sugar  
1 1/2 cups vinegar

Method: Mix ground vegetables together in large crock or porcelain or stainless steel pan. Sprinkle with salt and let stand overnight. Rinse well

and drain. Mix spices, sugars and vinegar in a large stainless steel pan or porcelain pan and bring to full boil. Cook ten minutes, mixing frequently. Seal in hot, sterilized jars. Makes 12 to 14 pints.

## Work Smarter Not Harder

Tired but can't figure out why? Physical work probably is not the only reason.

Psychologists say that putting things off and then worrying about them, planning to do more than can be accomplished, bottling up dislike of a person, living in a noisy situation, or not having ambitions fulfilled contribute to fatigue.

What's the solution? It isn't the same for everyone because first, you need to know the cause. If you're sure illness can be ruled out, then see if you can plan your work to save physical energy and allow enough time so you don't need to rush.

Also, make time for recreation and be selective when it comes to outside activities. This may mean learning to say "no" sometimes.

Clothes may look clean without being really clean if you take into consideration contamination by harmful bacteria.

A recent study of drycleaning processes made by microbiologists shows that some bacteria survive drycleaning. However, most of them are killed during steam finishing and pressing. In such places as sleeves and pocket linings, some bac-

teria even survive pressing.

This might suggest that especially after illness garments should be pressed. Many popular fabrics such as knits come through the cleaning process in good condition and you may feel they don't need further attention.

When you put away woollens and other out of season clothes, protect them from mildew and moths with one of the various moth control products you can get at a drug store. These control mildew also.

Check directions on the package for correct amount to use. Some plastics are damaged by these products. Remove buttons and other ornaments which might be affected. Don't use a plastic hanger for hanging clothes in a garment bag to which moth protective products have been added.

A recent survey of expenditure patterns of United States families made jointly by the U.S. Departments of Labor and Agriculture, shows that the average weekly cost of food for the person living alone was \$12.94 but for the two-person family it was \$23.37, an increase of 81 per cent.

## THURSDAY, JULY 21, 1966

Another interesting entry in this document was the following --- 8 lbs. bacon - 72 cents.

A Mr. Wade was original secretary of this "senate". It is thought that this may be a forerunner of the present Grange organization.

Antioch Club was formed by persons of this area who were displaced by formation of Camp White during World War II.
