
The city of Corvallis ended an 18-year period of no pedestrian deaths when the city suffered one fatality in this category in 1966.

Cities are judged according to their actual pedestrian accident records, plus official pedestrian accident prevention activities carried on by the city. Each city is classified according to population and motor vehicle registrations and competes with other cities in like category.

There were 748 cities entered in the population classification under 10,000 in 1966; 646 in the category, 10,000-25,000 271 in the category, 25,000-50,000; 137 in the category, 50,000-100,000.
