

FARM POINTERS

The market situation on potatoes has made little or no change since last week, says the O. A. C. extension radio reports.

Yellow varieties of corn are recommended for all growers in Oregon by the experiment station.

It is possible to plant wheat at this time of year sometimes and the chances for its survival are much better with the copper carbonate treatment than with previous methods.

Fall wheat, when sown in the spring, does not usually do as well as when fall planted, nor does it usually do as well as spring wheat planted in the spring.

According to varietal tests conducted for a good many years, the most productive spring oat varieties are victory and three-grain.

Farmers in many parts of Oregon are beginning to treat seed wheat for spring planting with copper carbonate dust.

Statistics of acreage in Oregon and in the United States show that the planting of winter wheat was considerably below normal in the fall of 1925.

The wheat situation has changed but little as the market has tapered off to some extent and demand in the Pacific northwest has lessened.

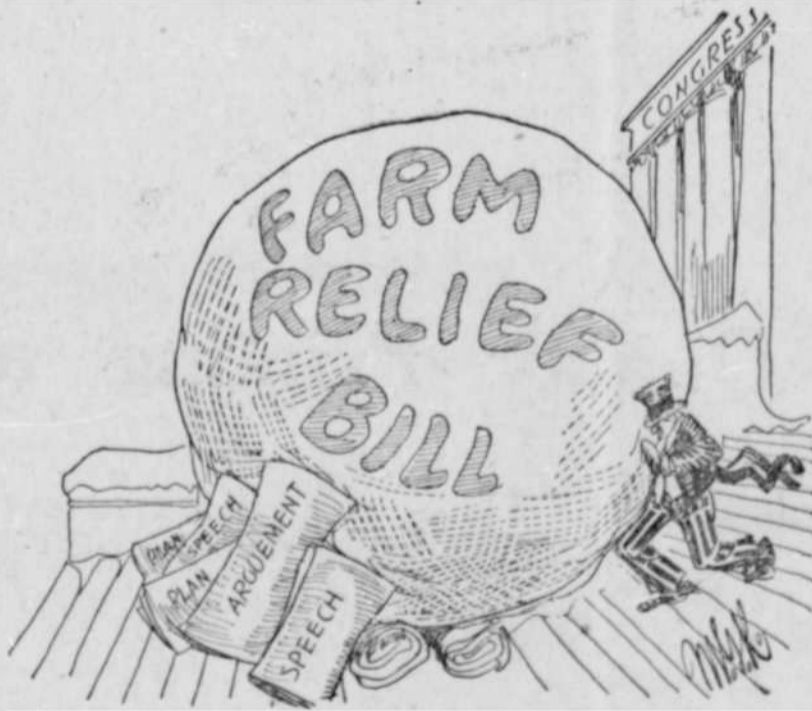
