#### \*\*\*\*\*\* Cost of Liberty Bell

The order for the Liberty bell was placed with Robert Charles. a London bell-founder, in 1851 and specified a weight of 2,000 pounds and a cost of 100,000 pounds sterling. It arrived in August, 1752. A clapper stroke cracked it while being tested and it was recast by a Philadelphian twice before it met the tests. It was hung in the steeple in June, 1753. When it was cracked again in 1783, a new bell replaced it.
