In round figures, the maximum annual production of the Butte, Mont., district is 300,000,000 pounds of copper, 175,000,000 pounds of zinc, 12,000,000 pounds of lead, 12,000,000 ounces of silver and 60,000 ounces of gold. An idea of the magnitude of the operations is conveyed by the fact that while Butte has on the surface 233 miles of streets, her underground workings aggregate 2700 miles.

The annual output of the Butte district in metallic copper, zinc, lead, silver and gold would fill 4569 thirty-three foot railroad cars, making a train 28½ miles long. Yet this is only three percent of the total amount of ore which has to be mined and treated to produce the above. and treated to produce the above ing the years of overproduction still amount of metal.
