## BUYING BABY CLOTHES

"That's where my money goes, Buying my Baby Clothes—"

The tininess of the stitches worked into the clothes of the baby-to-be was one way of measuring love in the olden days. It is not so today. This athletic age counts it a virtue to be up and out of doors, showing mother love by exercise and breathing proper amounts of oxygen, rather than sitting indoors stooped over fine linen, even for a baby-to-be.

The result is that many dresses for the newcomer are bought ready made, and—since the young mother has had no experience by which to gauge her purchases she and baby sometimes have to suffer along with a poorly selected layette.

The first thing to consider in choosing baby clothes is their health aspect. Will they be comfortable for baby to wear? Will they bind at his neck or be too small in the armhole? Is there scratchy lace around the neck and, are the garments warm enough, or too warm, will they be easy to put on and take off? How are they to be fastened, and, if buttoned, will he have to lie on hard buttons?

Will they launder well is an important question to ask.

Their durability is also something to think about. Most baby-clothes wear for just about one baby and a half. How many garments of each kind will you need is a matter which deserves study. This depends upon how frequently your laundering can be done, and upon the health of both mother and baby, as well as upon how much the baby will be on dress parade and how much he will lie alone in his inobscure corner. It is rather a sensible plan to get plenty of the more necessary and useful articles, slighting the accessories if anything. The latter can usually be purchased at any time, and you never know how many presents Sir Baby is going to receive. His gifts are more likely to be the accessories rather than the substantials.

## TOMATO COMBINATIONS

Tomato Shirr—Into a gem tin, put a half cup of tomato, cooked and seasoned with salt, pepper and minced onion. Drop an egg into each compartment, cover with buttered crumbs, and bake.

Tomato with poached eggs—thicken seasoned tomatoes with flour and when boiling hot drop eggs into it and poach as usual. Serve on toast.

Tomato-Corn Scallop—Put in a baking dish alternate layers of tomatoes, corn and crumbs. Season with salt, pepper, onion and green pepper and bake.

Escalloped Cabbage—Boil cabbage until almost tender. Put in a baking dish and cover with crumbs and tomato, and on top put a layer of grated cheese. Bake.

Tomato and Rice—Boil one cupful of rice in three cups of salted water until water has simmered out. Add a half can of tomatoes and a tablespoon of bacon fat and simmer until the liquid is gone.

Tomato is a valuable addition to almost any meat dish. It adds flavor

and makes the meat more tender by dissolving the connective tissue.

## MAKE A DATE WITH DATES

The date is a very ancient food, cultivated and prized from remotest antiquity. It's first home, so far as we know, was the Canary Islands and northeast Africa. From there it was carried to Arabia and India and has been a chief source of wealth and staple article of food in this region for ages. Attempts have been made to transplant it to Europe, along the Mediterranean, but the fruits will not ripen that far north. One of our best varieties of dates, however, is produced in Arizona and California, but it is a more expensive variety and most of the dates with which we are familiar are imported from the Persian Gulf and Africa.

Dates are not washed before being marketed as that would lessen their keeping qualities. For this reason all dates should be washed when used as food, and one is as certain to get clean dates if bought in the bulk as when buying package dates. Bulk dates are cheaper than package dates, and sometimes of better quality.

Dates are high in food value. They are not used as much as their value deserves. A nutritious and wholesome lunch might be a glass of milk and a dozen dates. Cut up, they are an acceptable addition to the breakfast cereal, in rice or tapioca pudding, in salads, and even in breads and cakes instead of raisins. Finely chopped and softened with cream, they make a delicious spread for sandwiches.

## FOOD HABIT SFOR CHILDREN

If, at every mealtime you worry about what your child eats, and whether he gets enough, you call particular attention to him and this encourages his habit of being finicky. Every child likes to be the star actor in the drama.

If you talk about his food habits before other people, that makes him feel important and he will want to keep on being different.

Even if he spills a little food, while he is learning to eat, that is much better than to make him become dependent and nervous and fretful.

If other members of the family are fussy about their food, the child will be so, too. Children are great imitators.

## Visitors in Portland

What the Oregonian Says About Ashland Visitors.

"Implicit confidence is voiced by E. V. Carter, banker, of Ashland, in the mineral resource of southern Oregon. "It pleases me," said Mr. Carter, who is on a visit to Portland with Mrs. Carter from the land of lithia, "to note the preparations for development in our end of the state. We have always realized that the mountains were loaded with mineral wealth and only awaited the coming of the right people to develop this resource. It now appears from reports that experienced mining people who operate on an extensive scale are interested in our mineral possibilities. Nothing could be of greater importance to the state. There must be untold wealth in the mountains and some day it will be taken out." Mr. Carter says that in his long career in Jackson county he has never before noted such mining activity as is now apparent in that region. The banker confesses that he hasn't any reason for coming to Portland on this trip other than that he has been coming here since the early '80s and had an opportunity for an automobile ride from Ashland to Portland and home again.

"The first year of the new state normal school at Ashland shows an enrollment of 500 pupils, and next month 100 will graduate," reports Postmaster Wagner of Ashland, in town for a visit. "The school is in its first year and, considering it being brand new, the enrollment speaks well for the future of the institution." The new normal asked the recent legislature for an appropriation for more building, but shortage of state finances prevented the buildings from being approved by the governor. Things are rather quiet in Ashland, adds the postmaster, but that is not local condition. The tourist travel from California is beginning to show up several weeks

late, but the indications are that there will be an unbroken stream of automobiles coming over the Siskiyou in a few weeks.
