(Continued From Page 1) was impossible to remove all of it, and the party left three times as much behind as they took along. Vases, utensils of all kinds, bits of artwork, a hundred different and interesting relics—never touched unless by a wandering animal or bird, since they were left by the ancient inhabitants of the precipitous caverns.

The entire 'haul' was taken to one of the large eastern museums where it will be put among other interesting relics.

Just how old these dwellings are, who inhabited them and when, are matters that geologists or historians do not attempt to answer. Mr. Seger says. However, from their appearance, it is evident that they are very, very old—perhaps hun-

dreds of years or even thousands.

The party was composed of geological students from many of the eastern universities and colleges. Mr. Seager is remembered by many in this city, as are his parents, Attorney and Mrs. George Seager, who moved east in 1915. He plans to go first to Crater Lake, return to Klamath Falls and board the train for Portland, Seattle and overland to Minneapolis.
