(Continued from Tuesday) Redmond and vicinity have irrigation so good crops is raised between the rockpiles. Elevation 3600. Here is where the road turns off over the McKenzie Pass, 20 miles to the west is the town of Sisters at the foot of the mountain north of the 3 Sisters mountain, the ascent over the pass from the east is very gradual and easy.

In fact one does not hardly know that there is a grade, and only a few miles up to the summit. Here is another freak of nature in times of the past the lava has rolled down from the peaks or higher mountain from the north, 10 or 12 miles away. Black brown in color with no green vegetation or trees, resembling a sticky farm across Bear Creek after it has been plowed dry early in the fall. The road runs on the edge of the lava bed, so to the right is the black lava, and on the other, green trees, descending from the summit east, which is very long the road passes through one succession of beauty spots after another until one reach Springfield and Eugene, on the way from Eugene we visited the old Applegate mansion near Yoncollo which is very interesting.

where the Applegate tribe came to visit most every Spnday from all the surrounding country some 70 or 80 years ago.
