After this unmarketable or poorly salable seed has been produced at substantially the same expense as good seed and certified grimm produced with slightly more care and little more expense is as good a yielder and is worth nearly twice as much. **Tuberculosis Gone**

You have cleared up the T. B. among your cattle almost completely and are satisfied with the result. There were kickers in the early days of the movement but you wouldn't go back to the old time condition now.

Poultrymen are now trying to help themselves get rid of profit taking losses from diseases by the certified or accredited hatchery movement. There are kickers but the movement for healthy chickens must eventually win if poultrymen stay in that highly competitive business.

In farm crops we have already passed thru much of that experience. Exporters of wheat and farmers said wheat was wheat and mixture made little difference. During the war the agricultural college saw that seed wheat in Oregon was badly mixed and that under the federal grading system (an excellent thing) soon to be established, farmers would lose unless they had pure wheat.

Many Varieties of Wheat  
 In 1918 there were 63 varieties of wheat commercially grown in Oregon and the state inspection department records show that 33 per cent of it was graded "mixed." The certification program has limited disease to some extent; it has eliminated 45 to 50 of the poorer

or accreditation or certification is a protection to you growers seeking a start of new crops.

And now a word about new varieties and new finds and new opportunities in Oregon. Probably the most important new thing is Ladino clover, that giant white clover from northern Italy. It is a rank grower, palatable and permanent, and is producing results at the milk pail, with the sheep, the pigs and the poultry. You cannot tell this valuable seed from that of common white so better buy certified seed and better still grow it as there are few places better suited to its production, and many pasturage growers want it.

**Assure Good Seed**  
 Don't think certification is primarily to bring a high price to the grower. Its main object is to locate and assure good seed to you—the buyer. It is true that the careful grower who grows seed good enough to certify, is entitled to and gets a higher price. So we say the registration

**Find New Crops**  
 New crops are found here and there in Oregon. Your Bulbous blue grass is enjoying new found popularity and two wonderful new Oregon bent grasses for golf greens will bring us in a good deal of money. It is the work of the experiment station to help find the true place for these things and for the extension service to protect the industry by certification.

Here and there we find a place for a new crop for which there is a demand or for a seed supply of some of our best varieties for which there is a need. We do not urge you to increase your grain acreage but rather to grow the yielding Federation wheat, Hannchen Trebi and O. A. C. No. 7 barleys and grow them pure to meet the seed demands. We urge growing more legume seeds to build up land and to supply market needs.

**Other Opportunities**  
 We believe there are other opportunities in balancing our production with our needs and in making a permanent and economical cropping system. An example is found with Jackson and Douglas, two of Oregon's best corn varieties, not only failing to meet the demand for over 2000 cars of corn annually being shipped to
