**American Legion**

The American Legion is winning the support of many good citizens who believed that its stand for adjusted compensation was the primary objective of the veteran's organization. Relief of disabled, Americanism, Community betterment and other altruistic Legion enterprises were overlooked by thousands whose opposition to the compensation measure was so great as to forget the other items on the Legion program held of equal importance by the Legionaries themselves.

With compensation out of the way, the veteran's organization has concentrated its activities on world peace measures, community betterment enterprises, Americanism and naturalization projects, in addition to its determined stand for relief of disabled fighters and the raising of a national endowment fund to care for the orphans of those who fell in the world conflict.

The American Legion is demonstrating that it proposes to live up to the preamble of its constitution, which states, "For God and Country we associate ourselves together."

To this end the Legion asks Congress to enact a universal service act, drafting the nations' resources of labor, capital and industry as well as fighting men in the next war. It is supporting General Pershing's program for an adequate national defense. There is an international organization, composed of service men of associated powers.

Better and more efficient service on the part of the United States Veteran's Bureau is sought by the Legion, which stated in its last convention that it would be satisfied with nothing less than

"super-service" for the disabled. The Legion obtained the passage of the Reed-Johnson bill which carried benefits for 100,000 veterans and their dependants and codified and liberalized the laws affecting the disabled, a measure called the greatest piece of constructive legislation since the creation of the veteran's bureau.

Legion members apparently are vigorous young men looking for work. The nation has many large tasks for them. Let them carry on in the same spirit of the Argonne and the patriotic citizens of the United States will back them to the limit.
