CANCELED CHECKS

Friday we mentioned the monthly statement of account which every depositor who has a checking account should get from his bank on the first day of the month, or soon thereafter. With this statement checks which have cleared during the month are returned to you. What do you do with them?

Canceled checks should be gone over and a record taken of the checks you have made— which are still outstanding, if any. Only when reported promptly is the bank legally responsible should these checks be found not to correspond with your records.

Your canceled checks are a protection as well as a convenience, for they are legal receipts for bills paid. They should be carefully preserved and filed.
