MAN HANGS BY LEG FOR FOUR HOURS BONES CRACK

Forest Steeves, a resident of the Port Orford vicinity, while cutting limbs from a tree, was caught by one in a crotch of the tree and suspended head downward, unable to extricate himself. Mr. Steeves found him two hours afterwards, and being unable to release him, went three miles for help and the man hung two hours longer. He was taken to the Bandon hospital where two bones above the ankle were found to have been broken.—Coos Bay Harbor.

As the moisture requirement for incubation in Oregon is quite confusing the experiment station suggests that probably the easiest method is to compare the size of the air cell of the eggs with that of eggs at the same incubation period under hens.

to be fed is provided with an opening just large enough to allow the lamb to crawl through. A self feeder or an open trough is arranged so the lambs cannot get into it. A supply of grain can be kept in this. A convenient creep can be made by placing a panel across an unused corner of the premises. An opening for the lambs to crawl through can be made by placing two upright rollers somewhere in the panel just far enough apart.

One good grain mixture is nine parts ground oats and one part linseed oil meal. Another ration is two parts coarsely ground barley, one part oats, one part wheat bran and one-half part oil meal. The equipment must be kept clean and free from soiled, spoiled or dirty feeds. Even where lambs are feeding on dry food in an open trough there is likely to be slobbering which causes the food to sour in the trough. Cleaning at regular intervals will avoid digestive disorders among the lambs.
