## Aliens from Yank Shores in Year

WASHINGTON, Oct. 6.—President Hoover was informed today a clamping down of the immigration laws had diverted 146,600 aliens from American shores during the last fiscal year.

With an eye to cutting off recruits to the army of the nation's unemployed, the chief executive announced more than a year ago semid-narrowed provisions of the immigration statutes would be enforced during the economic depression.

As the first complete report of the results of this step he made public today a statement from Henry L. Stimson, secretary of state, that visas had been declined to 68 per cent of the normal influx of quota immigrants during the fiscal year that was ended July 1.

Throughout the year, Stimson said, only 48,528 quota immigration visas were issued by consular officers abroad, as compared with the annual quota of 153,714.

The greatest decrease in visas issued was shown for Great Britain and Northern Ireland, with a quota of 65,712, of which only 10,917, or 17 per cent, received visas. Germany showed the next largest drop numerically with only 9,769 visas, or 38 per cent of a quota of 25,957.
