

Dr. Wilson to Retire from Office Nov. 30

The grand jury finished its work and gave County Health Officer Dr. B. C. Wilson a clean bill of health. Much criticism has been heard against the health department, through charges made by Mrs. King, a former nurse. Now comes word that the doctor will quit his post Nov. 30. The doctor says:

"During my two-year term I have noticed with disgust and dismay that one of the most essential and beneficial functions of the county government, namely the protection and betterment of the health of the general public, and the care of the poor and needy, has become involved in petty politics, assinine controversies and personal prejudices."

In accordance with the provisions of Section 1, Chapter 319, General Laws of Oregon, 1927, I was duly appointed secretary of the Jackson County Board of Health, and Health Officer of Jackson County, and was further commissioned by the Oregon State Board of Health to serve for a term of two years beginning Dec. 1, 1929.

Since my appointment as Health Officer of Jackson County, to the best of my ability I have directed my efforts in behalf of the health, safety and well being of the people of Jackson County, and in addition thereto have been responsible for the medical and surgical care of the poor of Jackson County, and have acted as County Allentist, Coroner's Physician, School Physician and Physician to all county institutions.
