### War Hero Is Honored

Merle Rodenberger, 1765 Revere St., San Francisco, received the Silver Star citation from the War Department in Washington Tuesday. The award is for service under fire in the Argonne in 1918. He received the order of the Purple Heart last month for his rescue of a comrade under fire.

**Silver Star Citation**  
The citation reads as follows:  
GENERAL ORDER NO. 42  
XVI. The Division Commander cites with pride the conduct in battle of the following:  
Merle M. Rodenberger, corporal, Headquarters Detachment, 4th Engineers, Chery Chartreuve, France, August 5-10, 1918.  
He showed splendid courage and absolute disregard for personal danger while acting as runner. He repeatedly exposed himself to intense bombardment while giving first aid and putting on gas masks on the wounded. With the help of one man whom he called to his assistance and using a broken-down German stretcher, which he was able to repair, he

succeeded in carrying the wounded to a place of safety over a shell and bullet swept field, thus setting a splendid example of bravery and loyalty to duty.  
By command of Major General Hersey.

Merle Rodenberger is a nephew of Mr. and Mrs. Ed Farra of this city. Merle was born and raised in Central Point and his many friends here will be pleased to hear that such honors were awarded to him. He is now living in San Francisco.
