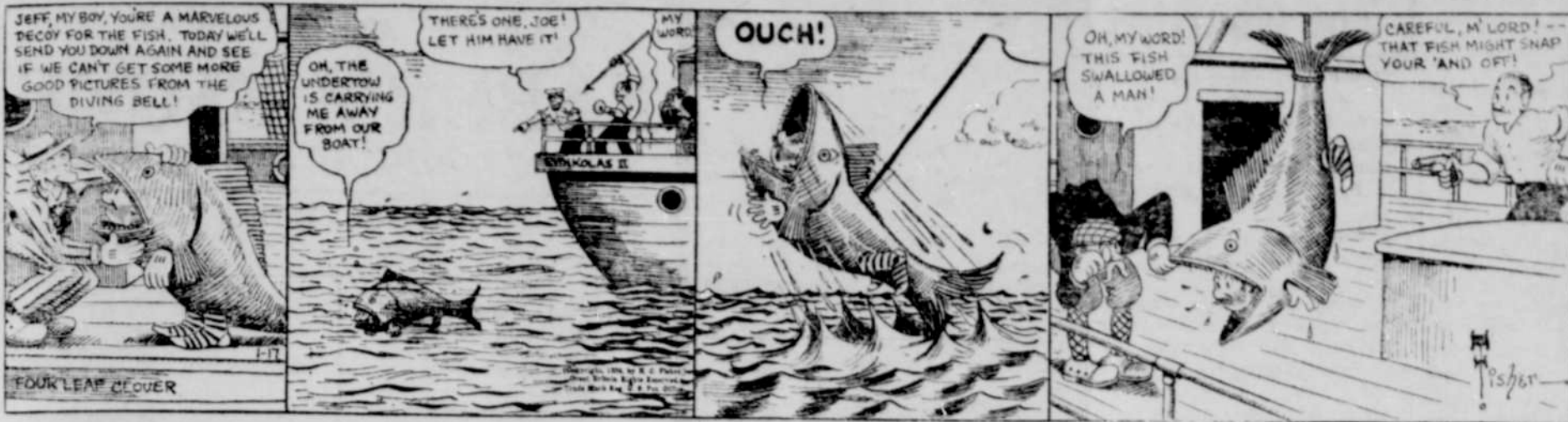

**FRESH APRICOT DESSERTS**  
The season for fresh apricots is comparatively short and a few suggestions for their use are timely. Apricots are not only delicious in flavor but have real food value as they carry both mineral elements and vitamins. They are especially rich in copper and iron and thus contribute to the blood building process.

There are literally scores of ways to serve apricots. Apricots are delicious sliced and served with cream and sugar. They may be eaten alone at the beginning or end of the meal, or combined with breakfast cereals. A favorite salad is made of halved or sliced apricots with a generous sprinkling of grated cheese and nuts for garnish. For variety they may be used with cottage or cream cheese and with either French or fruit dressing.

Fresh apricots, made into a sauce and served with vanilla ice cream, is delicious. The sauce is made by cooking for five minutes, the sliced fruit with a half cup of sugar and half cup of water for each cup of fruit used.

Other ways of serving apricots are:

- Apricot Marshmallow Pudding**  
1 cup coarse bread crumbs  
1 cup apricot pulp  
2 tsp. lemon juice  
2 cups milk  
3 egg yolks  
1-4 tsp. cinnamon  
1/2 cup sugar  
6 marshmallows
- Put the crumbs into a buttered baking dish and sprinkle with cinnamon. Add apricots and lemon juice. Add finely cut marshmallows. Mix remaining materials as for custard and add to pudding. Bake slowly (300 degrees) for about 1 hour. Top with meringue and brown in oven, or with whipped cream.

**Apricot Ice Cream (2 qt.)**  
1 1/2 cups sugar  
3 cup apricot pulp and juice  
1 1/2 tsp. vanilla  
3 cups rich milk  
1 cup heavy cream  
1 tsp. lemon juice  
1-4 tsp. salt

Mix apricots with sugar and stir until dissolved. When ready to freeze add remaining ingredients and mix thoroughly. Freeze using 3 parts crushed ice to 1 of salt. When very stiff remove paddle and pack in salt and ice.

**Apricot Box Cake**  
Cut an even slice from the top of a sponge cake, using a very sharp knife. Hollow out the lower part of the cake and half fill with fresh or stewed apricots, that have been sweetened and drained of all syrup. Cover apricots with a thick layer of sweetened whipped cream. Replace the top slice of cake and spread quickly with a cake icing made by stirring 1 cup confectioner's sugar into 1 unbeaten egg white and 1 tbsp. syrup drained from apricots to a smooth consistency. When ready to serve, cut the cake into squares or rectangles. If desired, the cake may be served with vanilla ice cream piled on top.

**State Fair Undergoes Face-lifting Operation**

Not monkey glands, but tons of paint and nails, and a wheel barrow load of steel wire brushes were the methods used in the rejuvenation operation on the State Fair plant, according to Max Gehlar, its Director.

"Forty-one buildings with a ground area of about ten acres came out of the depression manured, face lifted, or what have you, so that you need to be reintroduced to them to get on speaking terms," he states. "And here is the prescription which was administered:

- Paint, 12 1/2 tons, of which about 3 tons were aluminum.
  - New copper wire, 9 1/2 miles, also over 4 miles of old wire re-used.
  - Metal conduit pipe for wiring, 1 1-4 miles.
  - Lumber, 204,958 feet plus thousands of feet of old lumber re-used.
  - Cement, 587 bags.
  - Paint color, 499 pounds.
  - Nails, 3 1-8 tons.
  - Built up roofs, 16,200 square feet.
  - Shingles, 1193 bunches.
  - Water pipe, 1548 feet, with \$183.34 worth of glass, also cement, sand gravel, hydrated lime.
  - Two dozen flag poles.
  - \$761.23 worth of electrical cabinets and fittings.
  - Sixteen plate glass fish tanks.
  - \$95.75 worth of flower seed and grass seed.
- In addition, all usable materials have been salvaged and re-used.

**Park Visitor Recalls Former Visit in Snow**

Crater Lake National Park, Ore., July 18.—A big snow drift, ten feet deep, blocked the way to Crater Lake at this time of the month 27 years ago, Harry Clancy, Seattle, Wash., resident, recalled when a visitor here this week—the first time he had been at the lake since 1907.

A round-about route, rutted roads horses and wagons made the journey from Ashland, Ore., by way of Dead Indian, a long and torturous one. After numerous days of driving, the party arrived at Annie Spring, where camp was established for two weeks waiting for the July sun to melt the drift. The group stayed in the park all summer, during which there were hardly more than 100 visitors, Mr Clancy said.

This is in marked contrast with the present travel record of nearly 60,000 people so far this season. Distances which took days to cover in 1907 are now traversed in hours over highly improved entrance highways leading from Klamath Falls, Medford and Bend, bringing visitors from all parts of the nation.

**Millions Visit the National Forests**

A total of 34,672,125 persons entered the national forests of the United States last year, the U. S. forest service announced today. Of this number, over three and one-half million visited the national forests of Oregon and Washington, which was a slight increase for this region over the previous year, according to C. J. Buck, regional forester.

Camping in the national forests as a whole was increasingly popular, with 2,219,904 persons taking advantage of the constantly improving public camp grounds, an increase of 21,600 over 1932. Public camp grounds facilities were doubled in some of the forests in the last year with the aid of the civilian conservation corps, but much of this improvement work was finished too late in the season to become available last summer. Mr. Buck pointed out that to June 1 of this year the camp ground improvements completed by the C. C. C. workers in the national forests of Oregon and Washington had resulted in the cleaning and parking of 559 acres of camp grounds, building of 56 campers' shelters and other public buildings and construction of 1,446 other camp ground facilities such as water and sanitary systems, fireplaces, tables, and the like for public use on new or existing camp grounds.

Mr Buck said that there was an increase over previous years of some 45,000 motorists and other people who visited the national forests of Washington and Oregon, primarily to enjoy the forest beauty.

The reports also showed a total of 21,284,982 incidental or transient visitors to the national forests, the extension of highways and good forest use roads kept the flow of motor traffic about up to normal.
