Apple Marlow 1 cup apple juice 20 marshmallows 1 cup apple pulp 2 thsp lemon juice 1 cup whipped cream

Heat apple juice and marshmallows in top part of double boiler until marshmallows are melted. Remove from stove, add apple pulp and turn into refrigerator tray to cool. Adjust refrigerator temperature to coldest setting. When mixture begins to stiffen, turn into a chilled bowl. Beat with rotary egg beater, add whipped cream. (Taste mixture as it may be necessary to add more sugar, depending on sourness of apples.) Return to refrigerator to freeze. Serves 6 to 8.
