**National Bank Notes**  
Changes in our money on the scale of about \$500,000,000 are now going on through the retirement of national bank notes. This is reflected in increasing deposits in the Treasury of lawful money to replace bonds held against outstanding notes which will require some time for withdrawal from circulation. The change in the currency will require a considerable shift of bank funds in many cases, but it is doubtful if a large volume of currency has been retired and replaced in any country with so little disturbance.
