

### Students Warned on Federal Job Claims

With the approach of high school graduation, there is an increase in the activities of many of the so-called civil service training schools, the Portland Better Business Bureau reports. Numerous complaints have been filed with the Bureau by disappointed students who found that certain of the courses did not comply with the rosy promises of the sales representatives. The Bureau's report calls attention to a timely release of the United States Civil Service Commission which states:

"For a long time, the Commission has been receiving complaints from different parts of the country which indicate that opportunities for obtaining Federal employment have been greatly exaggerated.

It was made clear that no school has any connection whatever with the Civil Service Commission or with any other branch of the Government, and also that the Commission has no agents who solicit applications for civil service positions or who sell "civil service" courses.

No school can "guarantee" Government employment and none is given information regarding examinations, or any other information, which is not available to the general public. The Commission stated that it does not recommend any school, and explained that it is not necessary for anyone to take a course with a so-called civil service school in order to complete in a civil service examination.

A special point was made of the fact that information concerning examinations may be obtained at any time, without cost, from the Secretary of the Civil Service Board at any first- or second-class post office or from the Commission's office in Washington, D. C."
