Pioneer Woman Dies After Short Illness, Aged 68

Mrs. Jennie Elizabeth Merritt, one of the old time residents of Jackson county, passed away at a local hospital in Medford Friday evening, after a week's illness, aged 68 years. For the past several years she had been residing with her daughter at 16 Ross Court, Medford.

Mrs. Merritt was born at Clinton, Henry County, Missouri, in September, 1868, a daughter of William and Rebecca Moore. When 7 years old she came with her parents to Jacksonville, Ore., where she received her education in the public schools and spent most of her girlhood. Having graduated from the high school under the principalship of Prof. J. W. Merritt, she for several years taught school in Sams Valley.

On December 15, 1891, Genevieve E. Moore was united in marriage to John W. Merritt, who was then conducting a successful mercantile business in Central Point, Ore. Having started a similar business in Gold Hill, Ore., the family moved from Central Point to Gold Hill in 1916, where Mr. Merritt was actively engaged in business until his death in 1921. Mr. Merritt was well known as an able educator and a beloved and respected citizen of Jackson county. Of the union was born one daughter, Eather Louise, now Mrs. Bridane L. Sanderson.

Mrs. Merritt leaves to survive her daughter, Mrs. Bridane L. Sanderson, one grandson John Merritt Sanderson, now attending school in Portland, Ore.; one step-son, George A. Merritt, of Jacksonville, Ore., and one brother, Robert H. Moore, of Central Point, Oregon.

A woman of sterling character and steadfast in Christian belief Mrs. Merritt leaves besides her relatives a host of friends who will continue to keep her in reverent memory.

Funeral services will be conducted at the Perl Funeral home at 2:30 p. m., Monday, interment in Jacksonville cemetery.
