

Powerful New Streamline Train Is Now Planned

A new lightweight streamliner "City of San Francisco", 50 per cent larger and twice as powerful, is to be built to replace the present train of that name on the San Francisco-Chicago run, according to announcement by the Southern Oregon Company.

Designed with 17 cars instead of 11, to cost in the neighborhood of \$1,500,000, or about 50 per cent more than the "City of San Francisco" now in service, the improved rail flier will be completed early next year. It will be owned and operated jointly by Southern Pacific, Union Pacific and Chicago & North Western railroads, it was stated by A. D. McDonald, president of Southern Pacific.

Announcement was also made that Union Pacific and Chicago & North Western will construct a similar streamliner to replace the present "City of Los Angeles".

The larger and more powerful "City of San Francisco" will accommodate 228 passengers, 174 in Pullmans and 54 in the single coach to be carried by the train. As now operated the streamliner has a capacity of 170, 84 in sleeping cars and 86 in tow coaches.

Power will be furnished by six Diesel-electric engines, twin units being housed in each of three power cars, with a total of 5400 horsepower. The two power units of the present "City of San Francisco" have combined horsepower of 2400.

The power cars alone of the new train will measure 208 feet, and the overall length of the streamliner will be 1264 feet, or just short of a quarter of a mile, it was pointed out.

A duplex sleeper, and a two-unit dining car, will be special features. One unit of the diner will be given over to table space entirely, with seats for 64. The other will contain the kitchen and a 32-seat coffee shop.

Another improvement will be the full-length observation-lounge car to be carried at the rear. It will have a cocktail bar, and will also be fitted with a barber shop and shower bath. A club room is to be provided near the head end of the train.

Sides of the new streamliner will be vertical instead of sloping, and berths will be two and one-half inches wider and one and one-half inches longer than in the present standard Pullmans. Fully air-conditioned, the train will also have individual heat control in every room, according to the announcement.

The new "city of San Francisco", it was stated, will carry on the present 39 3/4 hour schedule, which enables passengers to make the 2264 mile trip between San Francisco and Chicago in only one day and two nights.

Forest Service Providing Many New Camp Sites

bath houses, water systems, camp ground roads, and community kitchen or picnic centers. At Lake of the Woods the Aspen Point camp ground now contains 21 individual camps, each having running water, stone camp stove, log table and a tent site. In this same area to the Willow Springs camp ground were added 7 new individual camps. Near the Lake of the Woods resort has been constructed a new boat dock with 2 floats, and also a camp with a double stove and 12 tables for the larger picnic.

At Fish Lake the same type of community kitchen with a fire place and tables have been constructed, and also 8 individual camps. At Union Creek 29 new individual camps were added to the already existing community kitchen. At the McKie Bridge on the Applegate a swimming pool, bath house, 6 stoves and 14 tables have been constructed. At Sulphur Springs up the Beaver Road a swimming pool and 5 camp stoves and 10 tables have been built. At Wrangle Cap on the Siskiyou Loop Drive a community kitchen with a fire place, 2 stoves, and 2 individual camps have been constructed. At the Cook and Green camp 3 stoves and 6 tables have been built. At the Trail Camp on the Siskiyou Loop Drive a novice ski run, a toboggan run, 3 professional ski runs and a shelter with stoves have been provided for winter sports.

In addition to this the Dead Indian Soda Springs Camp with the community kitchen, tables and individual camp was completed last spring.

During the summer in cooperation with the U. S. Bureau of Hatcheries and the State Game Commission, approximately 1/2 million trout were planted in the streams and lakes throughout the forest.

All of this work has but one aim to make it possible for you to more completely enjoy the Rogue River National Forest during the coming seasons.

Increase in Air Mail Use Shown

The increasing use being made by Oregon citizens of their air mail facilities was revealed today in figures showing that they sent out a total of 186,311 pounds of sky correspondence in the first ten months of this year. This poundage is equivalent to almost seven and a half million letters, according to Postmaster Pankey.

In the corresponding period of last year, 178,290 pounds of air mail was dispatched from Oregon points. Increasingly large gains are being shown each month, with faster schedules, the current rate of only six cents an ounce and a growing knowledge of the service offered as principal factors, Postmaster Pankey said.

Under existing schedules, air mail from Oregon reaches California point overnight and the Atlantic Coast with a loss of only one business day.

Parents Fail In Efforts To Find "Chore" Substitute

CHICAGO, Dec. 1—Present-day parents have been unable to find any adequate substitute for the now non-existent "chores" done by young people a generation ago as a means of developing individual responsibility.

Club work, summer camps and Boy and Girl Scouts have tried to offset the lack, but have failed entirely to take the place of those menial tasks for teaching the adolescent to manage affairs on his own.

This view of the maturing process of children was expressed today by Dr. Kimball Young, professor of social psychology at the University of Wisconsin, in an address before the Chicago Association for Child Study and Parent Education.

"Parents in our present-day middle-class America in particular," Dr. Young said, "do not prepare their children for their independence and freedom by building up in advance habits and attitudes of responsibility."

"The disappearance of what were known 40 years ago as 'chores' for the young lad illustrate what I mean," he said. "Even in village and small-town life of 1900, in most families the boy had a cow to care for chickens to feed or a garden to weed. And the girls learned to cook, mend, sew and care for the household."

"In contrast, today, with over half our population, living in cities, large percentages of our young people grow up without such obligations, without even a chance to assume responsibilities for such tasks."

Dr. Young declared parents are doing their children an injustice by bringing them up without the fundamental training necessary for the freedom which society believes essential to maturity.
