

### Huge Slide On Wertz Farm Buries Fence

CLIMAX, Oregon, July 9—(Special)—If the inhabitants of this community were the least bit inclined to be superstitious, they would surely think that the Gods of the underworld were having a quarrel or doing some rash thing, after looking at the havoc wrought to the hillside above L. H. Wertz's cow pasture.

A huge slide of uprooted trees, rocks and debris tumbled down the slope, covering the fence on the upper side of the pasture and extending down into the clearing about fifty feet or more. The slide was discovered early Tuesday morning but it is believed that it took place Monday because men on the Wertz ranch reported that they heard a creaking, tumbling sound on that day. However, no one investigated because it was thought that cattle were trying to break in and didn't succeed.

Another slide of the same kind occurred about seven years ago in the lower end of the eight acre clover and meadow-grass pasture. This slide covered about two acres and raised up a huge furrow nearly ten feet high as if an underground mole had been at work on a large scale. It slid down over the county road and necessitated the rebuilding of the road in a different place.

People of the community who are acquainted with the nature of the occurrence think that seepage from a tiny lake, which fills with water during the rainy season, located one half a mile above the pasture is an immediate cause of the hillside's desire to change its environment. However the fact that the pasture is kept irrigated all the time may have a lot to do with it.

Above the slide, discovered Tuesday, two other cracks have been lo-

cated in the earth and it is supposed that in a few more days it will also be crowding down into the pasture. Mr. Wertz hopes that the Gods of the underworld will soon desist from their quarreling and stop their foolishness because he doesn't want to have anymore of his good clover pasture ruined.

### Burned Laundry Plans Rebuilding In Near Future

Plans for rebuilding and restoration are being made by the Medford Domestic Laundry which was destroyed by one of the worst fires in recent years in Medford. Besides the laundry, Cupp's furniture store, Murray's Beauty Shop and the Tri-State Neon Sign shop around the corner on East Main street, were wiped out.

It is stated that a new building will be erected as soon as possible, but whether or not on the same location has not been decided. In the meantime arrangements have been made to continue business as usual. A temporary office is being prepared at 404 East Main street, across from the Sparta building.

Claims for loss of garments are being received at the new office and will be paid in full, according to the management. It is hoped that anyone having such a claim will present same as soon as possible. All clothing in the laundry and Zoric Cleaners was fully covered by insurance.

Full laundry and cleaning service is available as usual. The phone number is the same as before, 166.

The air show consisted of fancy stunt flying by some of the most expert fliers in the United States. There were both men and women pilots and some hair-raising stunts were performed. The show wound up with an exhibition of skill by Tex Rankin, champion stunt flier of the world.
