Mr. and Mrs. Moyer of the Medford Beauty school are taking a vacation in Portland and Eugene and expect to return this week end.

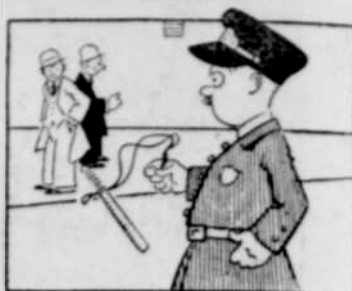
Mr. H. H. Borah who is caretaker of the Wells Mann place during Mr. Mann's absence in the east was shopping here Wednesday.

Mr. and Mrs. Marshall Simmons and little daughter and Mr. and Mrs. Fernland and family spent Sunday at Crater Lake.

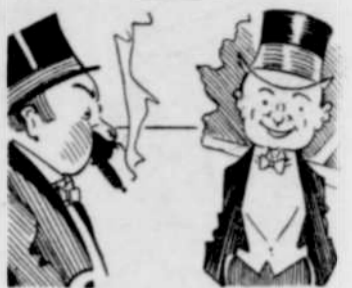

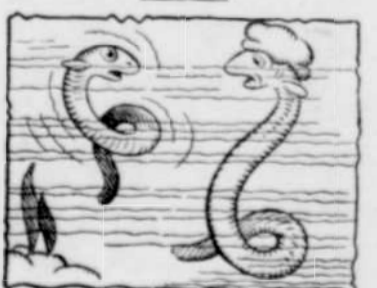
