## The Chatter Box

Perseverance is the material of which we bridge the chasm of difficulty and discouragement

ANSWER to last week's Brain-Buster, Byrons Enigma, is the letter (H).

**BRAIN-BUSTER** Why was the phrase, (In God We Trust) put on our money?—Answer net week.

The high school certainly had a roaring hot time at the rally last Wednesday night according to the size of the bonfire. They certainly had a good time. But—I wonder if they would work as hard to pile up wood for some poor widow's cook-stove? Verily, verily I say unto you, "I thinketh they would not."

### PRODUCTION, DISTRIBUTION AND CONSUMPTION

Did you ever try to balance a pair of scales with un-equal weights? Try it some time, but it can't be done.

That is just what we are up against when we try to balance production and consumption under our present system.

Remember little DAVID—JUSTICE, in the Bible? How he saw a small opening thru the mighty armor of UN-EQUALITY of GOLIATH, and how, with his little sling of understanding and a little rock of knowledge, he hurled the rock and knocked Goliath—Greed for the count of ten.

Now let us look at the age-old, green-eyed monster EXCESS-PROFIT right square in his green eyes, flashing with gluttonous greed.

Excess-profit is the business band-it that has been climbing on the scales of JUSTICE and throwing the entire system out of balance. It has been doing it since time beginning, and will continue to do so, very likely, but not necessarily, until Gabriel blows his horn on judgment morn.

Man, that is considered intellectual, is working under the EXCESS-PROFIT SYSTEM and what has happened in the past, what is happening now and will happen in the future? Man has starved, is starving and will continue to starve under the EXCESS-PROFIT SYSTEM, or just as long as he is forced to sell what he produces for less than what he has to buy at equal value.

A man gets down to a machine, (which another man's labor has produced for a small percent of its worth) and makes a 100 pairs of shoes. He receives, for his labor, the price of one pair of shoes. He has produced 99 pairs of shoes that he is financially unable to buy, or its equivalent, or in other words the man has produced 99% more than his earning power will allow him to consume. If the man had been paid for the full amount he produced, then he could consume what he produced, or its equivalent. Labor can never consume what it produces (AND LABOR IS THE ONLY PRODUCER) as long as it receives but a small percentage, or its equivalent, of what it produces.

The honey-bee, no larger than the end of a man's FINGER, PRODUCES WHAT IT EATS, AND GETS WHAT IT PRODUCES. (Except when robbed by the hands of man.) If the HUMAN LEACH, the POOL BROKERS, were eliminated, and all excess-profits were equally divided among the producers, (and not allow excessive, exorbitant salaries) then labor receives what it produces, and can consume accordingly. That is real co-operative earning

power. Solomon, of long ago, knew that co-operate on was the only answer to SOCIAL-SECURITY when he read, "Go to the ant, thou sluggard; consider her ways, and be wise; Which having no guide, overseer, or ruler, Provideth her meat in the summer and gathereth her food in the harvest. How long wilt thou sleep, O Sluggard? When wilt thou arise out of thy sleep?" Do the ants, I ask you, have a

bunch of POOL BROKERS that go around and force the working-ants to sell what they have produced for 10 cents a pound, and then when winter comes and the cry of the hungry working-ants reaches the listening ears of the Pool brokers-ants, and then the brokers return and force the workers to buy back what the workers themselves produced, for \$1.00 a pound? I'll say they don't. The ants are not PORK-BARRELLERS. They have more sense than that. It is not the size of the brain that determines the destiny of

living things, but its quality. I am not trying to preach Communism or Socialism. I am but illustrating the GREAT COSMIC LAW OF CAUSE AND EFFECT, EQUALIZATION AND JUSTICE. The cry of the people is for equal distribution, but that will never be until LABOR receives the equivalent of its productive power, and that will never be under the EXCESS-PROFIT & BROKERAGE POOL SYSTEM. Figure it out for yourself, at least THINK IT OVER.
