## Chiloquin Wins

### "B" Championship

For the second consecutive year, Chiloquin high of Klamath county won the district 14 championship of the Southern Oregon Normal school basketball tournament, beating Central Point last Saturday night, 44 to 21, in the finals.

By their win, Chiloquin earned the right to enter the state tournament in Salem.

Captain Rice of Chiloquin scored 15 points to lead all, while Scott collected 7 for Central Point.

Pink O'Connor and Blue O'Connor, twins, were named to the all-star district 14 basketball team by a committee and Tournament Director Jean Eberhart at the conclusion of the championship Chiloquin and Central Point game at Southern Oregon Normal last Saturday night. Chiloquin grabbed the other three first team positions—Rice, A. Giles and B. Giles.
