

C. P. Alumni Defeat All Am. Red Heads

Central Point alumni, led by Webster with eleven points, defeated Olson's All American Red Heads 32-27 Monday night on the local floor.

Central Point was in the lead all but the first quarter in which the Red Heads had a slight advantage of 8-4.

Kirkpatrick paced the Red Heads with ten points mostly on long howltzers from center court.

In the second quarter the alumni began to try to stop the Red Heads and themselves scored 9 points holding the all star girls to two.

The Red Head girls were exceptionally good on long shots but lacked the defensive power to stop the strong alumni team.

The third quarter was almost a repetition of the second, Central Point adding 9 to their score and the Red Heads four. The score at the third quarter was 14-22.

The final stanza the alumni made 10 points to the All American's 13. Central Point won, the final score 32-27.

The game was marked by the lack of personal fouls and also the superiority of the alumni in ball handling. While not being able to beat the C. P. team the Red Heads showed their ability and proved themselves to be probably the best in women's competition.

In the preliminary the C. P. town team proved themselves slightly superior to the Jacksonville Merchants by a 36-32 score in a fast and at times rough game.
