Violet Thumler Wins Honor on Americanism

To make us realize more fully the close relationship between liberty and Americanism, and the need for deeper and stronger patriotism, the Elks Lodge has sponsored a series of orations throughout the high schools of Oregon, recently.

The subject of the speeches was, 'Americanism, the Protector of Liberty.' The speeches were judged by their simplicity of style, strength of presentation, and clarity and logic of reasoning.

The preliminary contest was held at the Medford Senior High School, Friday morning, March 3. There were ten contestants entered from various high schools in the county.

The winners of the preliminary contest were, Violet Thumler, Central Point; Jane Hooker, Medford; and Jack Hamilton, Jacksonville.

Last Thursday evening these three students spoke at the Elks Lodge. Jane Hooker won the first prize of \$15 and the chance to compete in the state contest at Klamath Falls.

This is the first time the Central Point High School has entered such a contest and they feel justly proud that one of their students won such recognition.

Following is the text of the speech as delivered by Miss Thumler. Honorable Judges: Fellow Citizens:—

and earnest feeling to fight for our country. To uphold our flag. To present all statements made against our country and our flag. But what in time of peace? Do we stand up for America as we should? Do we fight for Americanism as we should? Do we uphold our country and our flag? No, we do not. Why not be just as loyal and true to our America in time of peace as in time of war? When I think of this matter, several things come to my mind. In the first place a question, of when does a country progress the most? In time of peace or in time of war. When we are defending our country against aggressive nations or warring on other weaker nations for our own personal gain, the thing that is utmost in our minds is the destruction of men and materials in the realm of our opponents, and the building up of men and materials in our own country for the purpose of carrying on a destructive campaign against our aggressors who are destroying our energies and facilities, of which we are very proud. But this does not build up citizenship, personality, and character in the minds of our young people. It does not help the development of scientific cure for fatal diseases, or develop better modes of more abundant living. Naturally a country is more progressive in time of peace. And in this country the people have a voice in deciding whether we shall have war or peace.
