**EDITORIALS**

**HIGH-LIGHTING POLITICS**

Washington—The current session of Congress is turning into one of the strangest that old-timers about the Capitol can remember. Congress has been here for over four months. Never have the domestic problems been more pressing. Yet all are being shoved into the back ground while the Quixotic New Dealers dig off furiously in all directions looking for newer and bigger windmills to fight abroad. As a climax to this four months of foreign clamor, Administration stalwarts now propose to dump the entire legislative program and send Congress home by mid-June, leaving the President to handle foreign relations without the Congressional influence against war.

Meanwhile, in every direction Congress peers there are problems at home crying for solution. Unemployment has soared to the 12,000,000 mark the highest in history except for the early days of 1933 when the New Deal came into power. The Wallace farm program has bogged down and rests upon the thin edge of how much money can be found as a hypodermic needle for farm prices and direct payments to farmers. Heavy stocks of cotton and wheat held by the government hang over the market. Relief payments are crushing the taxpayer on one hand, and on the other hand taxation is crushing business and stifling re-employment. Day by day radicalism in government, much of it directly traceable to Communist influences, is being uncovered by Congressional investigations. The New Deal's Treasury let it be known one day that it had a tax revision program designed to stimulate business and employment. The next day, the President and Democratic Senatorial Leader Barkley disavowed the program.

Apparently without a program to meet depression conditions, the New Deal wants to get Congress away so that Republicans and conservative Democratic leaders will have the floors of the Senate and the House from which to keep pressing domestic issues.

Strangest part of all of the political hodge-podge today is the efforts of New Deal orators to keep unemployment alive as a sin of the last Republican Administration while the American Federation of Labor estimates unemployment to-

day at 12,000,000. Despite the billions of dollars spent and seven years of New Deal operations, the current unemployment is higher than any time under the Hoover Administration, except the period after the 1932 elections when Mr. Roosevelt was coming into office. Whereas every act of the Republicans then was aimed at bringing recovery and getting men back at work, the New Deal now accepts mounting unemployment and turns to foreign affairs for headlines.

General Hugh S. Johnson, in his pungent style, has recently given a 40-word description of the New Deal that deserves to live beyond one speech. The General said: "This is a gambling government. It has shot craps with destiny with a sure to five billions a year—at least five times—on a bet that it could restore our prosperity. It has lost on every single pass".

Politicians who have viewed with alarm the steady rise of Senator Job Taft as a presidential possibility thought they had their opening recently when the Senator charged that President Roosevelt was using the war scare abroad to cloak the New Deal failures at home. New Deal writers and speakers denounced the Ohioan for such a bold attack. Some Democrats joined in. Just a week later when Senator Jankhead, a New Deal spokesman at the Capitol, proposed an early adjournment of Congress, Senator Taft found many supporters. Veteran Senators Connolly, Texas Democrat, and Johnson, California Republican, quickly voiced their insistence that Congress remain in session, fearful that the New Deal's playing with fire abroad might lead America into war.

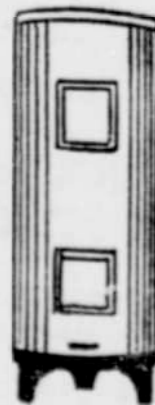
