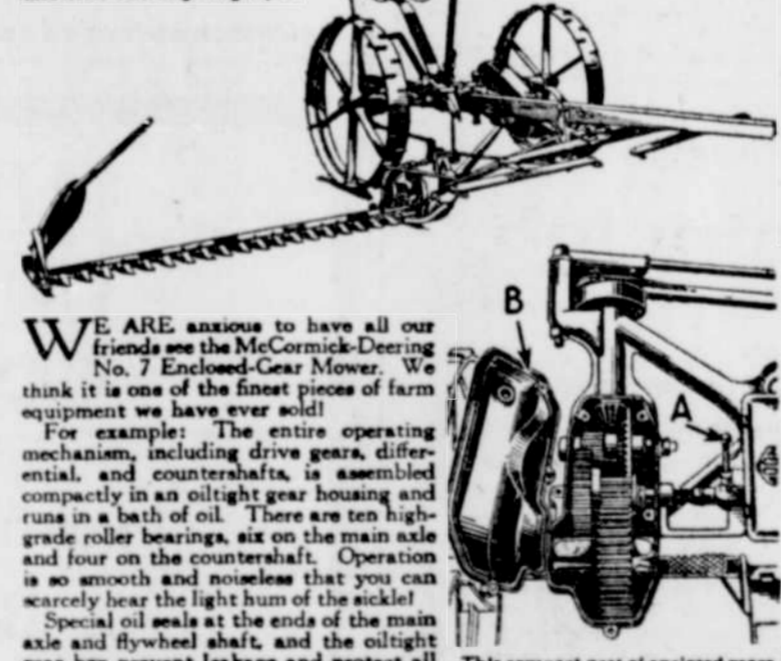
Mrs. Jim Brisco, who has been quite ill, is improving. Mrs. Brisco lives in the Mayfield house.
