Talking of steelhead fishing, I had considerable fun this week when I hooked so many steelheads and got only three nice ones. The largest weighed 7 pounds and 15 ounces and the smallest 3 pound. I do not understand why most fishermen persist in using spinners or bait for steelhead fishing while at this time of the year the fly fishing is at the peak. I have been using No. 4 Gray Hackle, yellow body, and so far it has brought me very good luck. There is a new fly that I have never used before and it is called the Silver Rogue. It looked awful good to me in the water and about the only thing wrong with it is that I have been unable to hook a steelhead though I have had a lot of good strikes on it. Maybe somebody else might have better results with it than I could.

Last Tuesday I went out to Dodge Bridge to see if I could get another steelhead on fly. Coming down to my favorite riffle and after casting a few times, when goes my fly and soon I was busy hanging on to the pole and looking for a good landing place. While busily engaged in wading back to the land, I noticed that the line had become tight and there seemed to be no play by the big 'un. After trying hard to make the fish move, I realize the old, old story that the wise old fish had circled a big boulder and wrapped the leader so tight that it tore out the hook from its jaw. So, forced to take off my shirt and leaving my swimming trunks on, I swam over to the other side and dived down about 4 or 5 feet deep to unravel the leader from the big rock. Gee, the water was sure cold and I just shook my hand at that steelhead.

Because ever since 1930 at least once a year a steelhead had taken my hook and dived down and wrapped it around a boulder to tear out the hook and I have to do the same old story of wading or swimming out to get the hook untangled from the big rock. When it happened last Tuesday, I am beginning to wonder if it is the same one that has given me the same trouble ever since 1930. If it is, I would give anything to have it hooked on my fly and in a riffle where there is sandy bottom and no boulders at all. Well anyway, later in the evening I hooked another steelhead which weighed five pounds dressed.

I have entered my big 7 pound and 15 ounce steelhead in the steelhead contest at Ross & Ross

and all boys who enrolled in that contest must feel discouraged and considerably disappointed to see that I am still hooking big steelheads. Of course before the end of the contest rolls around someone else may get a bigger one but I still believe that I will get a bigger one to make it a runaway on my part. I would not be surprised that next year if they run another steelhead contest that they will raise a squawk if I enter the contest again.

I hooked my first steelhead on a fly I hooked my first steelhead on a fly some 12 years ago I have had wonderful luck on steelhead fishing even during the poorest years. And will continue to do so as long as there are steelhead in the river. I am not an expert fly caster. I could not compete worth a nickel in any fly casting tournament but give me a riffle where there are fish and I will catch more fish than most of the more skillful fly fishermen in the valley.
