## Radio Ham No. 1

The article below was copied from the United Ham News published in Portland once a month. Mr. and Mrs. Richardson were former telephone operators in the Central Point Mutual Telephone company until Mr. and Mrs. Jack Sharp took over.

Medford belongs the distinction of being the birthplace of one of Rogue River Valley's most widely experienced Amateurs, "Sandy" Richardson, W7DHz.

He didn't stay there long before the pioneering instinct got the best of him, and he went north (four miles) to settle on the plains of the flourishing little city of Central Point, Oregon. This was in 1909, he has been there ever since with no hopes (he hopes) of ever moving. Hams may come and Hams may go in Central Point, but DHz remains forever the No. 1.

The Richardson family is a busy one, with "Sandy" being chief operator at WUBG, district headquarters CCC station, Medford, teaching code to young government operators, look after the "C" camp nets, servicing BCLs, clearing house for all kinds of Ham gear (a junior Bob Henry)—and of course, there is some amateur operating.

The XYL has a paper route covering about fifty miles every day, and she is also the champion rolling pin thrower of the OARA.

Getting along to the rig—we stuck our neck in behind a rack and panel job having the usual power supplies and a 6L6 PP xtal osc, 35T buffer doubler with 35Ts PP in final. This rig works on 20-40-80 CW and 10-75 meter zone. You can see the effects of running a telephone office once upon a time for the rack has a "key shelf" at table height, and here sets the receiver all nice and handy. That, in my opinion, is the handy way to build a rig. If one is going to "rack and panel" why not have it all there; it takes up so little room.
