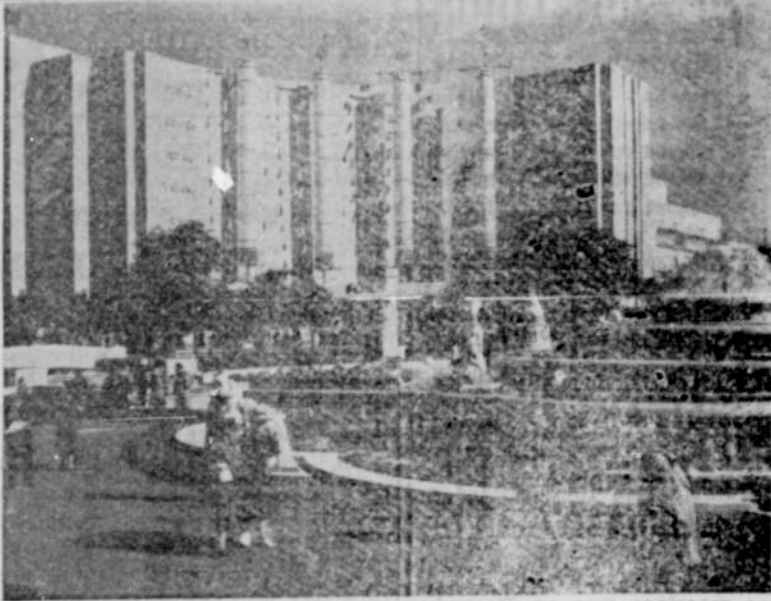


28,000,000th Ford Enroute to Fair Opening



Ford car No. 28,000,000 is now enroute to Treasure Island from Edgewater, N. J., via Mexico. The symbolic car was built at the New Jersey Ford plant on April 8 and immediately began a 10,000 mile international good will tour. Naval Air Base At Astoria Expanded

The Tongue Point Naval Air Base at Astoria, Oregon, will be designated for expansion, probably to double its present authorized strength, under legislation which is scheduled to come before the Naval Affairs Committee of the House for consideration in the immediate future.

This proposal was disclosed to Congressman James W. Mott (R. Ore.) today by Chairman Vinson of the House Naval Affairs Committee, who within the next few days will submit to the Committee a new Naval Shore Station Bill designed to strengthen the aerial defenses of the Pacific and other coast lines of continental United States.

Congressman Mott, who is ranking Pacific Coast member of the Committee and who sponsored the Tongue Point legislation in the House, said that in his opinion the new Vinson Bill will receive the approval of both the Committee and the House. It is in line with the future objectives for Tongue Point announced by the Oregon Congressman when the Naval Air Base on the Columbia was established last year after a long fight against a succession of adverse reports from the Navy Department.

The Tongue Point Station under the existing authorization is being built to base two patrol-bomber squadrons. Under the expansion proposal four squadrons of patrol-bomber planes would be based there, together with an increased complement of anti-aircraft and other facilities for the defense of the Columbia River area.
