Already selected on a tentative basis are players for "As You Like It" and "The Comedy of Errors"—two holdovers from the 1939 repertoire—and "The Merry Wives of Windsor." Director William David Cottrell is picking his cast for "Much Ado About Nothing" and the announcements late this week. Rehearsals are being "staggered" on a consecutive basis.
