EDITORIALS

THE CASE OF WENDELL WILLKIE

In the World War, Wendell Willkie enlisted as a private. He spent four months intensive training before he was commissioned as a Lieutenant. He spent another year in training camps in this country and was then sent to France where he served under fire. Just before the Armistice he was recommended for promotion to a Captaincy. All of his commanders approved the recommendation but he never became a Captain because when the war ended President Wilson suspended all pending promotions. But Elliott Roosevelt, without spending a day in a training camp, is appointed a Captain.

Is it any wonder that the case of

Elliott Roosevelt has made the blood of every World War veteran boil? Such things do not happen in a democracy. They do happen in countries ruled by men lustful for power—indispensable men who seek to perpetuate themselves in office.

IS THIS A "FREE ELECTION"?

In his "non-political" talk at the University of Pennsylvania, Third-Term Candidate Roosevelt put forth this plausible and appealing suggestion in an effort to explain away the New Deal's effort to seize permanent power:

"As long as periodic free elections survive no set of people can permanently control government."

The fatal flaw in this oleaginous statement is that free elections are not surviving in the United States.

The "set of people" who control the government are spending billions of the people's money to corrupt, coerce, intimidate, purchase, and delude voters into supporting the New Deal and a third term for Roosevelt.

Money appropriated for relief is in the hands of crooked city machines in New York City, Chicago, St. Louis, Jersey City, Memphis and other centers.

Postmasters under civil service and therefore nominally exempt from blackmail are being forced to contribute to the New Deal slush fund. The Democratic National Committee's official report shows that more than half of the individuals contributing \$100 or more between June 1 and August 1, 1940, were postmasters.

Congress squelched the Roosevelt scheme to set up a permanent Federal film service, but New Deal propaganda films had already been made by

an allotment of over \$300,000 of relief money. The Women's Division of the Democratic National Committee, with headquarters in the Hotel Biltmore, New York City, has sent to Democratic women workers in every State a bulletin telling how these Federal propaganda films can be obtained, free of charge, by applying to the New Deal agency concerned.

Constant and cunning exaggeration of world perils is employed by the New Deal for the purpose of terrifying the voter and deluding him into the notion that only one man—Roosevelt—can save him and the country.

The Hatch Act prohibiting pernicious political activity is being shamelessly violated during this campaign by the Third Term New Deal "set of people" who "control government."

Mr. Roosevelt declared that the powers accumulated by the New Deal could be used in the hands of others to shackle the freedom of the people.
