Willkie Receives

1587 Majority

In County Vote

Wendell Willkie, Republican candidate for president, carried Jackson county over his new deal rival, President Roosevelt, by a majority of 1,587 votes, with 56 precincts complete and 13 still missing, all small.

The vote:

Willkie-McNary 7,056
Roosevelt-Wallace 5,469

On the face of complete unofficial returns from 56 precincts, Bruce Spaulding, Democrat, was leading I. H. Van Winkle, Republican, for attorney general by the slim margin of five votes.

The vote:

Spaulding 5,675

Van Winkle 5,670
Svenson 93

For the state legislature, W. M. McAllister and E. T. Newbry were leading in 56 precincts complete, with W. M. (Farmer Bill) Carl, Democrat, in third place.

The vote:

McAllister 7,716
Newbry 7,328
Carl 3,383

Congressman James W. Mott in 56 precincts polled 9,520, and had a lead of 6,082 votes over his Democratic rival, Charles A. Robertson, who polled 3,438 votes. Upton A. Upton received 93 votes.
