If the government finds out that you are not living up to the rules, the next new A books to be released next summer will only limit you less than 4 gallons, maybe 2 gallons. Maybe none at all. For you never can tell what the government will do next. I have heard of some people who hope that the government may give the A book holders more gas for summer vacations—don't make me laugh. And I am against that too. Unless the B and C holders have made fair and proper uses of the book for their real business I might think highly of having more gas for the A book. Not now, there's still too many traitors here in the valley.

### Letters From Our Boys in Service

April 4, 1943

Dear Friends:

I have been meaning to write to you for a period of months but between work—Japs—and other incidents, just haven't gotten around to it. We are now enjoying our rest period after a couple of months in combat with the yellow horde. And dirty little devils they are, too.

There is really nothing to say in regard to the country, only that there are no women, and no civilians. The terrain is mostly jungle, and mosquitoes are terrific. In fact, you really can't discriminate between a mosquito and a B-24—only the mosquitoes aren't armed. But altogether, it's really a charming place—South Sea—breezes, warm ocean waves to play in, tropical flowers to enjoy looking at. Great for a naturalist—but I'll take Central Point even tho' soldiers are overrunning the old town.

Am still receiving your paper and it's a high note in the midst of a funeral march on this barren rock. So thanks for sending it and I hope that I may continue reading it, the mail willing.
