South America As Seen by Local Lady

Mrs. Mildred Swain is writing to her mother, Mrs. E. E. Scott, from South America, where she is with her husband, who is employed by the government rubber research.

Continued from last week

Well; What did you do for the Fourth of July? We had an American celebration down here, believe it or not. The first American holiday to be observed down here and it was quite an affair. First the two girls where I lived gave a cocktail and supper party for fifty people—they have a large Latin-looking flat or apartment which is huge and which swallowed up the fifty people. That lasted until about 1:30 when we all went to the beautiful Rio Negro Clube as Amazons—the last word in a modern building and which would do credit to New York City. I believe I have described it to you. We had reserved ten tables for the Americans from the girl's party and they were on the patio of the club building where we had a bird's eye view of the interior of the club and also of the court and formal gardens which surround it. At midnight the Brazilian orchestra played the Star Spangled Banner and the house rose in a body and the Brazilians payed homage to the Americans by standing and clapping at the end. Immediately following the fireworks started at the edge of the open patio and they were beautiful—even had airplane flares which could be seen for miles around. All in all it was a lovely party and the American and Brazilian flags flew on a level over the congregation of people. I think everyone enjoyed themselves immensely and for a short time we could imagine we were celebrating our own holiday in our own country. I wondered what you folks were doing back home to celebrate

the 4th or if it was observed this year because of the necessary work in defense plants. I was so sorry Joe couldn't be down here for he wanted to so much but it's better for him to finish up completely and then come and stay.

You said in one of your letters, Mother, that I hadn't told you about Manaoa. Well, maybe I haven't told you much about it but you'll have to admit that I've written some pretty lengthy books about the country down here and have given you all the details of my trip to Manaoa. When I first arrived I wrote down my impression of the city as it appeared to me then so if you'll bear with me I'll copy of what I wrote then and in a later letter give you still more details.

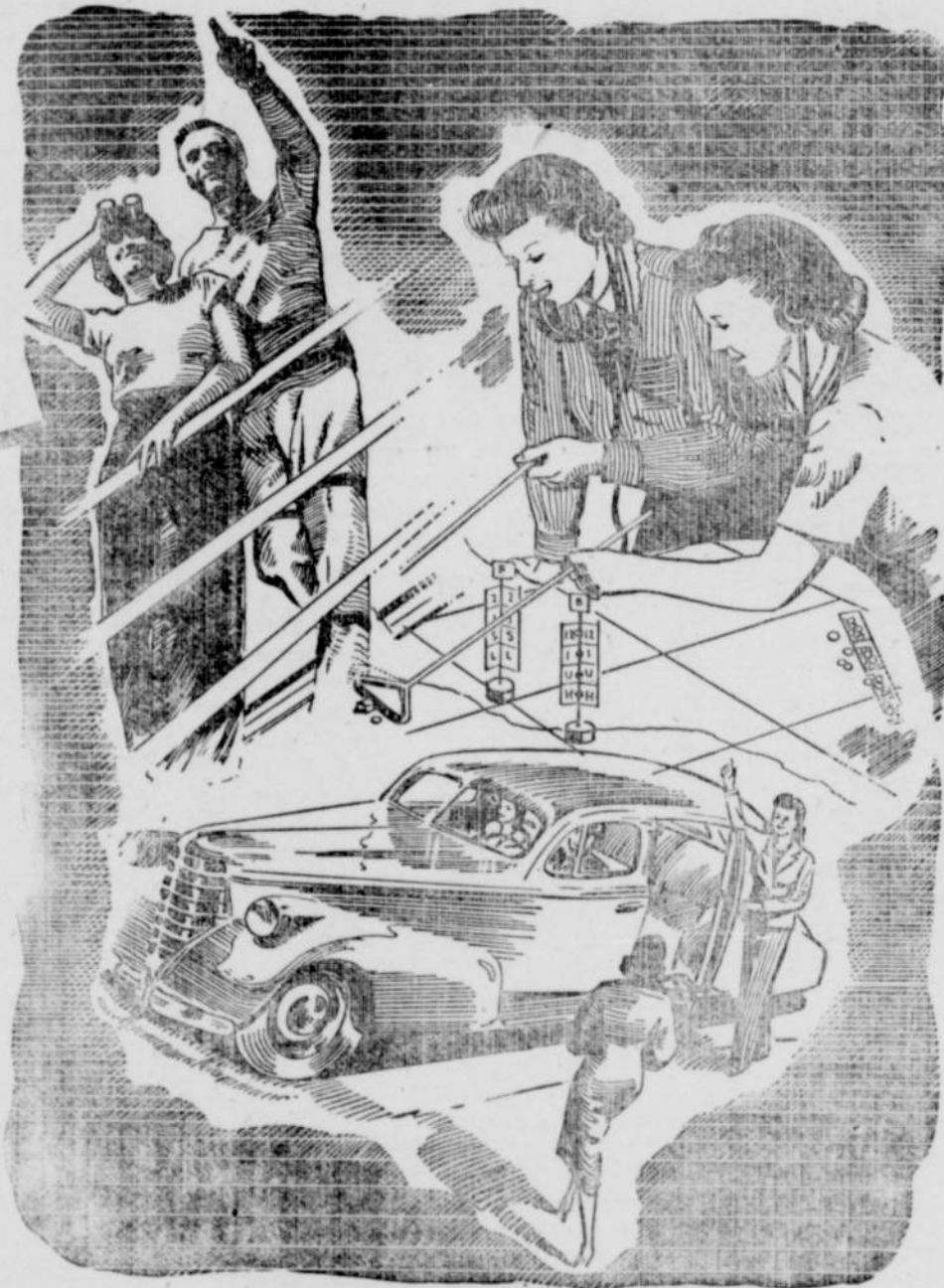
