South America As Seen by Local Lady

Mrs. Mildred Swan is writing to her mother, Mrs. E. E. Scott, from South America, where she is with her husband, who is employed by the government rubber research.

Continued from last week

August 10th, 1943

If you weren't the grandest folks in history you wouldn't be getting this letter today but since you are I'll get a line off to you even though I know it will probably be the shortest letter I've ever written.

I have been the most rushed person in Manaus ever since the last plane landed which has been some time now. A week ago last Sunday Joe blew in from Porto Velho quite unexpectedly and brought with him JoAnn and Patsy Pease—the daughters of the Peases with whom I stayed in Porto Velho and they have been with me ever since and every day is filled with entertaining them, movies, swimming, trips to every part of the city, dinners galore both here and at other people's houses, birthday parties and me trying to run a brand new house on the side until I'm about run down at the heels. I've been trying to get a booking for them to return home for the past three days but no luck to date as so many planes have been taken off the run. Now today as the last straw Joe received a wire from Washington, D.C. ordering him to Peru for one week and not more than two, to leave at 5:00 A.M. tomorrow morning. That meant all his friends stopped by tonight to wish him a nice trip and so my last chance to write letters flew out the window. I promise to write you many for the next flight and this is just to let you know that we are fine and happy. I will miss Joe terribly while he is gone. He is going to Iquitos, Peru, now and perhaps Lima but that will be decided at the end of the week—to install an accounting system.

We haven't had a plane for two weeks from the States as we had an accident here and one of the planes burned in the harbor—quite accidentally with no one hurt—and consequently in the future we probably won't have mail service more than once a week to every ten days. I wanted to tell you that we received your two letters written July 21st and 25th to night and were surely glad to get them. Also the things you sent including the flour sifter. The servants couldn't figure out what the sifter was, imagine that. I'll give you the details later.

I have secured a wash lady now, so I have a Barbadian, cook, a Portuguese maid (in Manaus 3 years only) and a Brazilian wash lady so who says I'm not democratic. Joe is waiting for me to finish this so he can mail

it. The girls are in bed and it is 10:00 P.M. but the office is still open for so many Americans are standing in line to get their mail after this long wait for mail from home.

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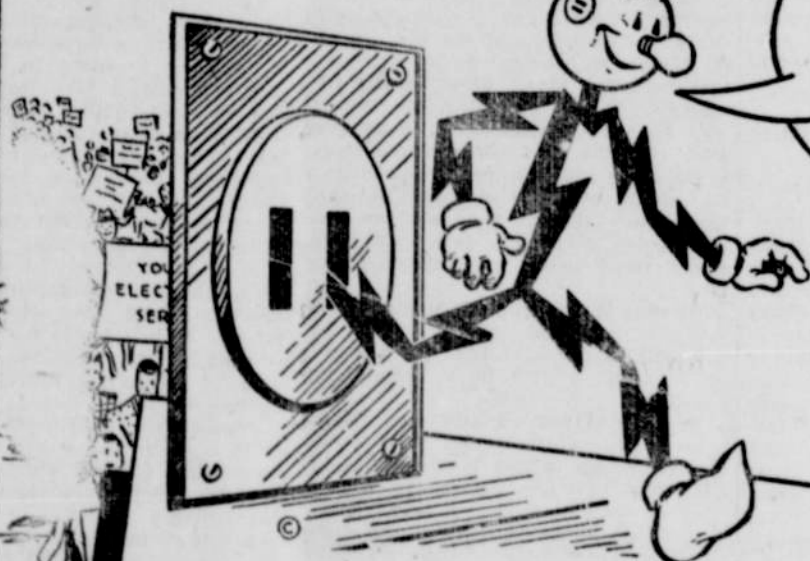
