

Pointers Lose To Redskins

Last Monday night the Central Point Pointers played host to the Jacksonville Redskins and were defeated in a fairly fast game. At the half the Pointers had a 15 to 14 lead but the Redskins came back after the half to close the gap and pull ahead of the Pointers, and go on to win by the narrow margin of 35 to 32.

The first half went well with the locals being ahead 12 to 9 at the quarter and 18 to 14 at the half. In the first half there was a total of 12 fouls committed, 6 on each team.

After the half the game began to move much more faster with the Redskins beginning to close in on the Pointers. In the third quarter Jacksonville scored 10 points to the Pointers 6, thus making the 3rd quarter score 24 up.

The game continued on at a fast clip in the fourth quarter with the Pointers making a desperate bid for the game. At the first of the quarter the Redskins begin moving again, and were never headed after this point. Jacksonville kept control of the ball most of the latter half of the quarter to try and keep the Pointers from making a last minute rally and here the game ended.

The game was highlighted by the duel between Harris of Jacksonville and Shrier of the Pointers for top honors with Shrier making 17 points to Harris' 14. Pointers Edge Out Rogue River 34-33

For the first time in six years, the Central Pointers defeated the Rogue River Rogues on their floor, by a score of 34 to 33.

The game was undoubtedly the closest and most exciting game the Pointers have experienced this year. The game went basket ball for basket all the way, the Rogues leading by a small margin during the first half and the Pointers leading by a smaller margin in the second half.

In the first quarter the Rogues started out by canning four beautiful long shots and making three foul shots, against the Pointer's five points to make the first period score 11 to 5 in favor of the Chieftains. Seven fouls were called on the Rogues during the first quarter and three on the invaders.

In the second period the scoring went about the same and the half ended 19 to 15 in favor of the Rogues. In this period Tommy Colley swished a beautiful long shot from the center of the floor.

After the half Central Point started playing ball, and on some long, over the shoulder shots, Wilson connected for six points and Shrier and Childress each got 2 points to put the Pointers ahead 25 to 23. This lead was never relinquished throughout the rest of the game.

In the last quarter, Rogue River lost Dimmick and Lee on personal fouls. The latter got his last foul when he smeared Shrier and almost put him out of the game. During this period the scoring was about even. The Pointer held a two point throughout the last four minutes and attempted to stall it out, but the fighting Rogues got a hold of the ball and just before the end, Freeland fouled Burton giving him two charity tosses. He missed the first one but made the second. Then the Pointer took the ball out of bounds and the whistle blew ending the game.

It was a very rough game on the whole, there being 14 fouls called on the Chieftains and 10 against Central Point.

High point man for the evening was Shrier who collected 12 markers for the Pointers while Wilson made 11 points. Dimmick led the Rogue's attack with eight points which he collected by shooting high, long shots from behind his ear that seemed to never miss.
