There were 15 of them who descended on the city after having visited several other cities and they left this morning for Porto Velho and will travel from there into Bolivia and on down to South Brazil. They represent the leading newspapers of the United States. They were telling us Sunday that Firestone has offered to pay all expenses if they will visit the Liberian plantation and report on that. The purpose of the trip is to report the rubber industry, I believe. We were asked by Mr. Allen, the president, to house the men while they were in Manaus since our home is the largest occupied by the Americans down here. We told them we would be glad to, however, at the last minute the Grande Hotel was rushed to completion and a section of it opened, also the dining room, and we were saved by the bell. While it would have been a lot of added work I would have enjoyed them, I'm sure. Sunday the Powers That Be of Manaus—Brazilian Authorities—gave a lovely party for them at one of the

large clubs which is situated a short drive from the city in the jungles. It consists of a large club house where there are plenty of tables, a good floor and music, then, huge grounds with an immense swimming pool and play grounds, also some horses. All the Americans were invited and Joe received an engraved invitation which included his "family."
