We are I cannot say for obvious reasons. The work is progressing very well and we feel it a very direct contribution to the war effort.

We live in what we call "tent city" among cork trees. Our living conditions are similar to camping out back home. On the whole everything is fine. We have good food and the climate is delux. This country is beautiful. We are camping and working near a port town. A short distance inland are beautiful snow capped mountains. Fast running streams like upper Rogue River and high rough rocky cliffs.

In the narrow valleys grow palm, eucalyptus, bamboo and scrub pine trees. There is a little farming, not much, and that is done by oxen teams to a great extent.

The little towns all look very much alike and usually are built right on a mountain side. The roads from one town to another are relatively smooth and on a fair grade but are very narrow and crooked. The little bridges are made of stone and look like they were built many years ago. Almost all houses are of stone with tile roofs. Usually they are two or three stories high. Inside the houses one finds the furniture very primitive.

The people are French. On the whole they do not appear very aggressive but just live as their people did years before them. They all appear very poor in fact I don't see how they live. According to American standards the people here live on a very low level. It makes one who sees the condition be plenty thankful that we are Americans. I am afraid many of our U.S. citizens do not appreciate what they have.

We fellows want to work hard and get this war over so we can head back home on the double. With my best regards to the people of Central Point and community.
