Next day, lunch time caught up with me yesterday and in the P.M. I dragged Joe downtown shopping with me so my letter went by the wayside. I bought two pairs of shoes which look quite American. They are from Rio and are very nice. Purchased some chewing gum also and have I been busy? I rarely chew gum but if I can't get it then I really want it. In the hotel they have a huge, beautiful U.S.O. for the boys and have hamburgers with onions at the snack bar where Joe and I are spending our time. Boy, or boy, are they ever good.

There is so much to tell you and this is such a slow process this way but in my next typewritten letter I'll try to give you all the dope. Today we saw the most beautiful park I have ever seen in my life and I seriously mean that statement. It is completely tropical with palms, bamboo trees, ferns and every tropical plant including thousands of orchids and other beautiful flowers. Also peacocks, bright colored Macaws (something like parrots) in every color under the sun and other gorgeous creatures roam at will through this park. There are winding stone steps up to a solid rock cave which is covered with deep green moss and beauty on every side. We spent two hours there and cov-

ered about one quarter of the park. We took a lot of movies of the place which will give you a faint idea of its beauty but most of it is in such deep shade from the foliage from the tall jungle trees that I wonder if the winding paths and beautiful flowers will show. Anyway we felt it was worth the try. I'll tell you more about it later.

Just had lunch at the hotel, and learned that two more of our girl friends are due in today enroute back to Africa and are we excited. "Mathilda Chancellor and Peg Hazerty." They were in Africa the two years we were there and they will be staying at this hotel. Also there is a third girl but we don't know her. Sure wish you were here too. I put my cook in charge of our house in Manaus and Ila (who lives there) is keeping an eye on things. Heaps of love and remember us to everyone.

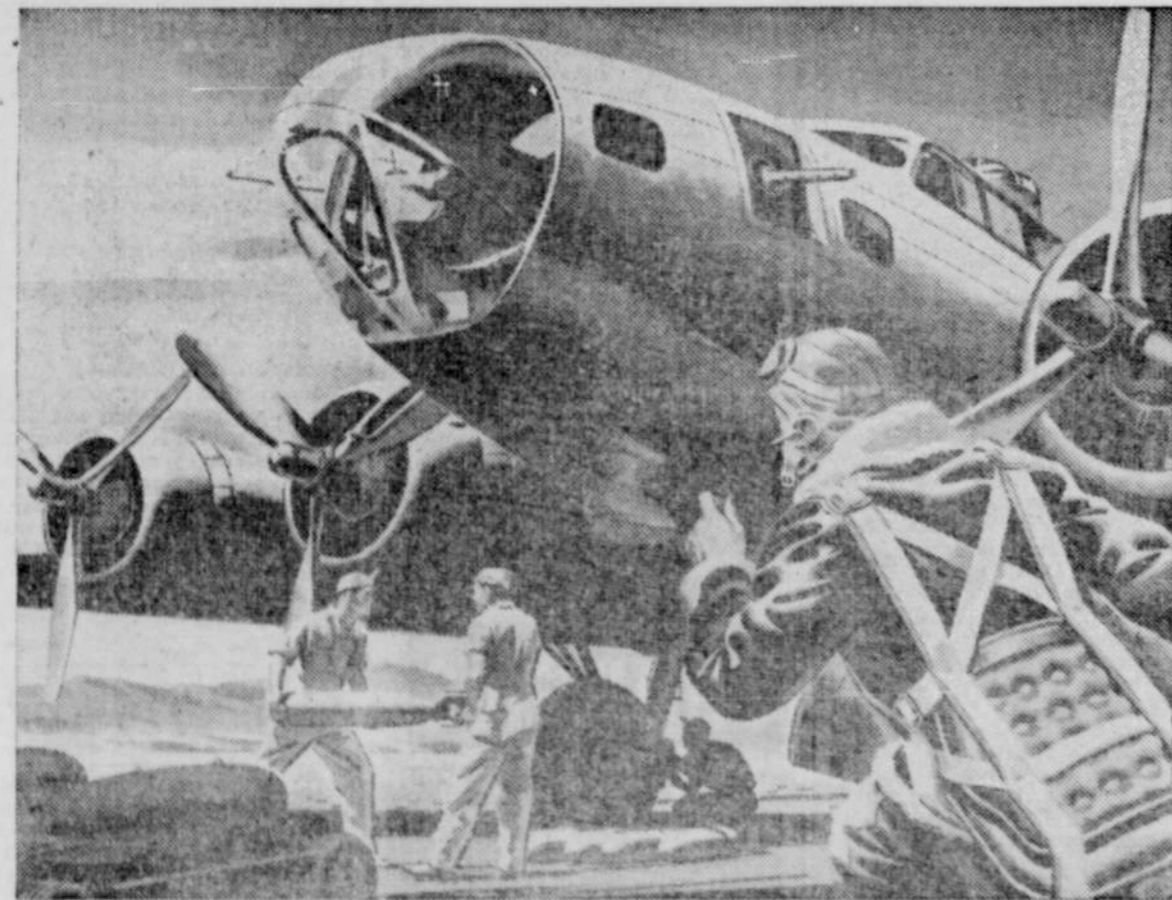
