NOTICE OF SPECIAL SCHOOL MEETING

Notice is hereby given that, at a special school meeting, hereby called, to be held at the high school building, in and for School District No. 6 of Jackson County, Oregon on the fifth day of October A.D. 1944, between the hours of 8 P.M. and 9 P.M. there will be submitted to the voters thereof the following questions:

Question 1—To authorize the school board of School District Number 6 of Jackson County, Oregon, to provide transportation to and from the school in said district for pupils residing within the boundaries of said District No. 6 but outside the corporate limits of the City of Central Point, as provided in Section 35-917, Oregon School Laws, 1937.

Question 2—To authorize the school board of School District Number 6 of Jackson County, Oregon, to issue not to exceed \$5000 in negotiable interest bearing warrants of the district, as provided in Chapter 192, Oregon School Laws, 1939, for the purpose of financing the purchase

of sufficient buses to provide transportation for pupils residing within the boundaries of School District 6 but outside the corporate limits of the City of Central Point.

Question 3—To authorize the school board of School District No. 6, Jackson County to issue, if necessary, regular warrants of the district in a sum not to exceed \$4500 for the purpose of maintenance and operation of transportation services within the boundaries of said School District No. 6 as provided in Section 35-1009 Oregon School Laws 1937.

The polls for the reception of the ballots cast for or against the above questions will, on said day and

date and at the place aforesaid and opened at the hour of 8 P.M. and remain open until the hour of 9 P.M. of the same day, at which hour the same shall be closed.
