South America As Seen by Local Lady

Mrs. Mildred Swain is writing to her mother, Mrs. E. E. Scott, from South America, where she is with her husband, who is employed by the government rubber research.

Mr. Swain gives a description of his trip to various outposts of the company located in jungle, where he went to audit the books.

Manaos, Amazonas, Brazil

November 26, 1944

Dear Folks:

By now I suppose you have heard that I needed another vacation from your daughter and made a swing of all of our interior branches.

We took the R.D.C. Grumman amphibian plane with Pilot Wally Gardner at the controls and Co-pilot and Flight Engineer Andy Fisher (an old friend of ours from Firestone, Africa) assisting. Three passengers started from Manaus at 6:20 A.M. last Monday, the 20th of November: Chas. Davis, of the Commercial Department, an American who has lived in Brazil for ten years and more; Orlando Succi, one of my assistants; and myself.

The takeoff was uneventful and we buzzed the house to say good-bye to Micki. Apparently we came too close to the house for the comfort of Violet since Micki informs me that she was standing out in the patio waving her arms at us and telling us to go away.

If we did not steal your only National Geographic map of South America you can see we set a southwest course generally following the Rio (river) Maderia for Porto Velho, arriving on the airport there at 9:20 A.M. During our trip to Porto Velho last year we took pictures of the house occupied by the Pease family. This house is right on the edge of the airport since all of the new houses of the Madeira-Mamore Railroad are clustered around the airport. Merl and Mary Jane Mayor now live in the Pease house and I stopped and saw them for a few minutes. Also saw our friends, the Greens, in Porto Velho.

Since Porto Velho was really only a gas stop and there was very little work needed there—all distribution of foodstuffs and tapper's supplies in the Territory of Guapore is handled by the Territorial Government and not by R.D.C.—we took off from the airport at 11:15 A.M. bound for Boca do Acre.

You will notice Boca do Acre is at the apex of the Rio Purus and the Rio Acre. There is no airport at this town. The only means of landing is

on one of the two rivers. We first buzzed the Rio Acre hoping to land but found it too full of logs to attempt a landing. We then swung over to the Rio Purus and were able to duck into a fairly open piece of water. It was necessary for us to cross the apex of the two rivers and, where the waters meet, found it tough going to get through the logs and debris which were eddying in the meeting of the two rivers. We finally taxied up to the Pan-Air do Brazil float in the town of Boca do Acre.
