The nicest part of this whole trip—that is for my waist line—was that missing of meals. We received no lunch at Boca do Acre and had rice and beans and some kind of meat at night. Breakfast, which is properly called "café," is a demi-tasse half full of sugar with a little coffee added. In our honor they fried some "Cana" which we could not eat. Cane in the event Micki hasn't previously told you, is a substitute for potatoes and is a root something like the Casava root we had in Africa only much, much drier. Unless properly prepared by mixing plenty of milk and butter and mashing it it is impossible to swallow since it clings to our mouth and throat and will not go down.

Tuesday, Nov. 21st, we crossed the river to the Pan Air float and inspected our last warehouse in this district. Since, as I mentioned, the river had risen three feet during the night, it was unusually full of logs and debris. It was a case of preparing for an emergency takeoff and then closing your eyes and hoping for the best.

Really, since I have been accused so many times of not writing maybe this would be a good time to say "good-bye" for this letter and maybe write more on the trip at some other time.
