2nd Lt. Pinkham in Action over Germany

AN EIGHTH AIR FORCE BOMBER STATION, England—Second Lieutenant Ernest J. Pinkham, 25-year old pilot from Central Point, Oregon, was among the American airmen who flew in the mighty B-17 Flying Fortress formations, which recently struck two Eighth Air Force heavy blows on consecutive days, against industrial targets and marshalling yards on eastern Germany. The attacks, in close cooperation with the advancing Red Army, were directed against the important industrial center of Chemnitz and the key rail center of Cottbus, second only to Berlin in handling the flow of German supplies and reinforcements to the Russian front.

Lt. Pinkham, son of Mrs. Alice M. Pinkham of this city, is a member of the 493rd Bomb Group, a unit of the Third Air Division, the division cited by the President for its historic England to Africa shuttle bombing of aircraft plants at Regensburg, Germany.

HOME ON FURLough

Ray McKnight, 31c, son of Mr. and Mrs. Joe McKnight of Lazier Lane, is home on a 13-day leave after action in the Philippine Islands. He participated in two major battles and wears the purple heart. McKnight is stationed on an escort carrier. He has been in the navy since February of 1944, graduated with the class of 1944 from Medford senior high school, has been on sea duty since Sept. Ray McKnight is a grandson of Mr. and Mrs. Ray Wilson of Jacksonville. Mr. Wilson who works in Wilson's Hardware store, reports that his grandson and a friend were setting in a door of the ship when the bomb struck it and they were both pitched out into the water. McKnight remembers turning over three times before he struck the water next thing he knew he came to under ten feet of water. When he came up he inflated his belt and in about thirty minutes he was picked up by a big destroyer. He remarked that he had always wanted to be on a destroyer but didn't want to get on one just that way. McKnight arrived by plane which gives him 11 days at home.
