Letters from Jan. 1st to Feb. 26th

Somewhere in Italy

Dear Folks:

I received a letter from you today and also one from one of the boys in Old Co. "C" who was wounded a few days after I was, he is still in the hospital in the states but expects to get a discharge soon. I am fine and still in the same office. Nine months at the same place has begun to make me an old timer here. I was cleaning out my "trunk" (an old ordnance paint box) and was reading some of your letters that I had saved. I have been so lucky to receive such good letters after being away from home so long.

I sent your birthday box today. Mother, a pillow top, also an oil painting. I nearly spoiled it before I could get it packed. The Italians told me I could roll or fold it but I found out different. It is a fair example of Old Mt. Vesuvius when it erupted last spring. I always wanted to see this old country but never wanted to stay there as long as this. Do you get those yank magazines and Stars and Stripes I send home? They have some good articles I want you to read. You ask me about evergreens. There were Christmas trees for sale in the cities, "domestic frown and wreaths." We had a lovely tree in our mess hall with colored lights and all. Those people like celebrations, they have a name day as well as a birthday date they celebrate and of course they have lots of religious holidays. The woman who work in the office, had it well decorated for Christmas. They have made it possible for me to forget a lot of the horrors of this war that I experienced.

I am about two hundred miles from Roland Hoyer, I believe. I received a letter from him and he likes his new place fine. Many of the boys like to move around a lot and see more of Europe but I am satisfied to stay until this is over, if they will discharge me then.

Your last letters came over in eight and ten days, that is very good time as much mail as the army is sending overseas, it is remarkable it gets here as soon as it does. One of the boys, who I had in my machine gun squad, and who went home with Sgt. Chaffee, is working in a big post office in New York City. He likes the work and is near enough home to go there on a three day pass. I sure wish I had gotten to go to the states with them but I wasn't that lucky.

We've been having nice weather here the past week or so. I know February is always nice in Oregon, the daffodils should be blooming again.

To each, every and all of the above named Defendants:
IN THE NAME OF THE STATE OF OREGON, You and each of you are hereby required to appear and answer the complaint filed against

you in the above entitled suit on or before the last day of four weeks from the date of the first publication of this summons, and if you fail so to appear and answer said complaint, or want thereof, the Plaintiffs will apply to the Court for the relief demanded in their complaint, succinctly stated as follows, to-wit: That a decree be entered adjudicating any and all right, title, estate, lien or claim which you, or any of you, have, or claim to have, in, to, or upon the real property described as follows, to-wit:

East 2.60 chains; thence North 79 1/2 deg. West to the south line of the property above described; thence Easterly to the point of beginning.

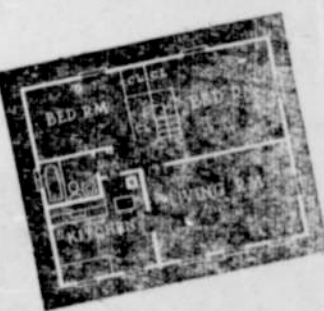
